CLANTON FAVORS ELIMINATING ALL SEINES ON ROGUE

"There should be no seines allowed at the mouth of Rogue river or any other coastal stream in my opinion," said Ed Clanton, master fish warden on his visit to Medford yesterday, "and your closed season should be extended at least to May 1st, in order to protect your trout fishing which is a very valuable community asset. I have never taken any part in the so-called Rogue river fish controversy, and would express no opinion on the so-called McCleay agreement, but the experience of all fishing streams is the same.—If you don't exercise radical safeguards, your fish will disappear, and the time to take action, is now before it is too late."

"The fishing season starts in Rogue river earlier than in any other stream which is a great mistake. An extension of the closed season for two or three weeks will be a material benefit. It will allow the trout to come up stream, and your fish crop can be planted so to speak, before the harvesting starts in. The week end rest for the canneries at the mouth of the river should also be extended. It is an easier problem to protect the salmon than the trout, for the former come up from the ocean when they are grown while the trout start in as small fish, and are seriously depleted before they reach any size. The state fish and game officials are ready to cooperate in every way with the sportsmen of southern Oregon, for their interest is mutual in preserving sport fishing as a state asset."

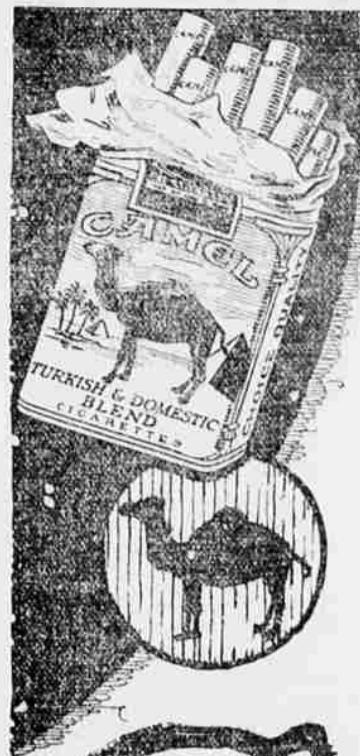

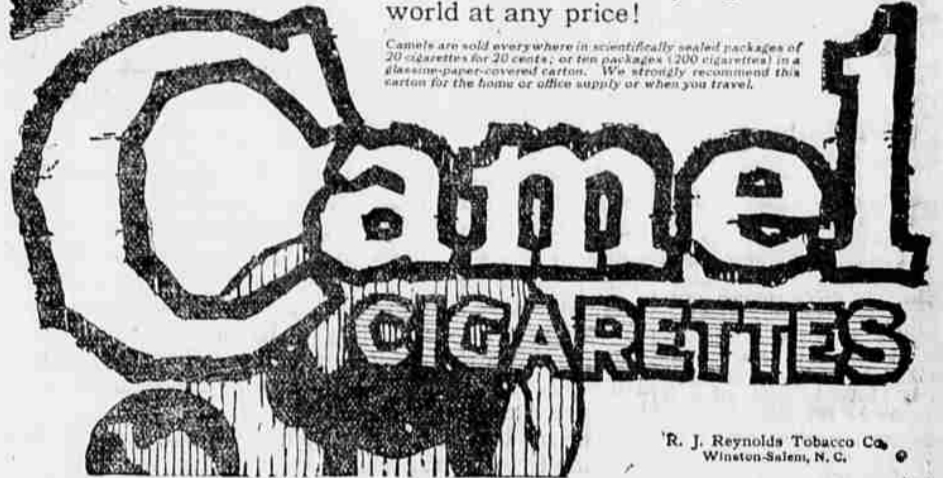

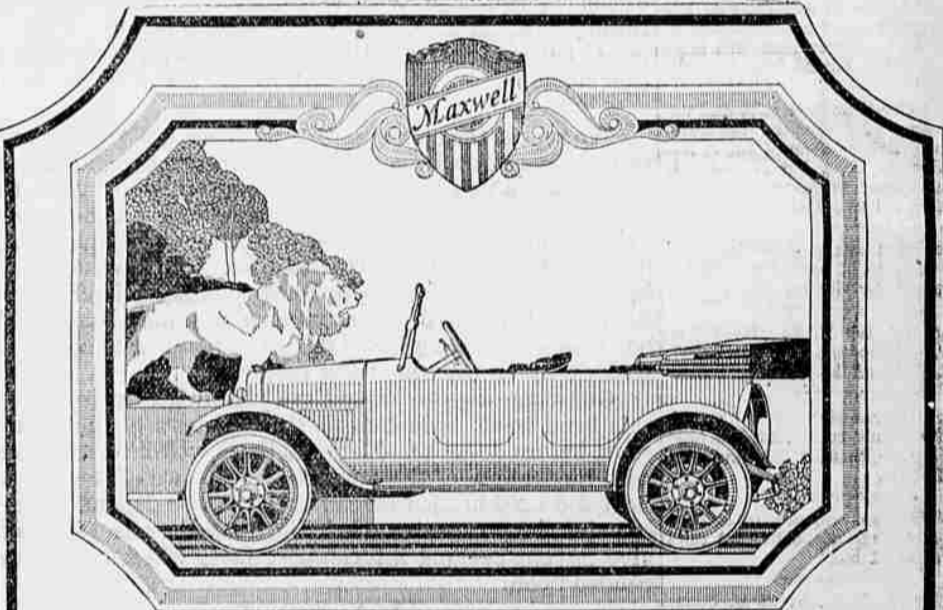
