MEXICAN REBELS EFFECT A NEW OIL AGREEMENT

MEXICO CITY, May 21.—Confirmation of reports that petroleum interests have reached a satisfactory agreement with the present temporary government of Mexico was obtained yesterday by the Associated Press from Aureliano Mendivil, in charge of the treasury department.

He stated that imposts for March and April, decreed shortly before Carranza's fall had been withdrawn, the companies agreeing to pay the rates collected for January and February, which were two and one-half times less than the rate fixed by Carranza for the second six months of the year.

WASHINGTON, May 21.—The state department received today a summary of a circular issued in Mexico City by the provisional government which apparently sets out a new policy as to tax payments.

Mexico City papers yesterday carried reports that revolutionary forces were in close pursuit of President Carranza. They also said the contest for provisional president to be named by congress May 24 would be between General Gonzales and Adolfo De La Huerta.

General Obregon has returned to Mexico City. La Huerta is expected to arrive Monday.

ETON, England, May 19.—Women members of the rural district council, it is announced, are to be permitted to smoke "to keep them in good humor, to expedite business and as an antidote to a badly ventilated room."

LEONARD BOUT IN PORTLAND IS OFF, CALLAHAN INJURED

PORTLAND, Ore., May 21.—The proposed ten-round boxing match between Benny Leonard, world's lightweight champion, and Frankie Callahan of Brooklyn, scheduled for this city June 21, has been cancelled, according to Bobbie Evans, matchmaker of the Portland boxing commission. Callahan has broken his hand, according to a message received by Evans, and will not be able to box for a month.

This does not cancel the date to box which Leonard has made, Evans says, and he will have to find another opponent to meet the champion. Several prominent lightweights are under consideration, Evans said today. Leonard has signed an agreement, according to Evans, to box any opponent here on June 21, the bout to be for ten rounds, no decision.

FAVORS LOAN TO MEXICO AS CURE

WORCESTER, Mass., May 21.—An immediate loan to Mexico was advocated by Dr. I. J. Cox, professor of history at Northwestern university, at the Clark university conference on "Mexico and the Caribbean," today.

Dr. Cox, who was a member of the commission of 1918 to study conditions throughout Mexico, said the problem there was one of self-help or self-destruction. "Carranza," he said, "reposed a program combining political privilege with social regeneration. Carranza failed for lack of adequate funds to maintain his army and his public servants. His successor must not be permitted to fail for like reasons. An immediate loan adequately safeguarded will insure against such a failure."

WEALTHY DRAFT DODGER ESCAPES

PHILADELPHIA, May 21.—Grover C. Bergdoll, notorious draft evader, escaped from custody today. He had been confined in a military prison near New York serving a five-year sentence and was brought here to sign papers. Watching his opportunity, he dashed from a lawyer's office to an automobile waiting outside and in an instant was out of sight.
