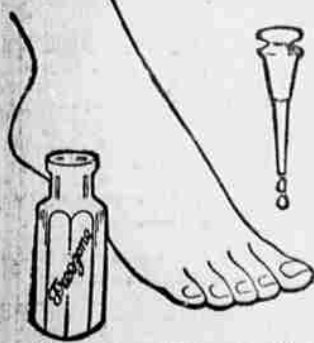
SINN FEIN VICTOR IN COUNTY TYRONE

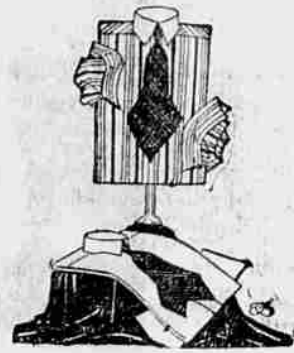

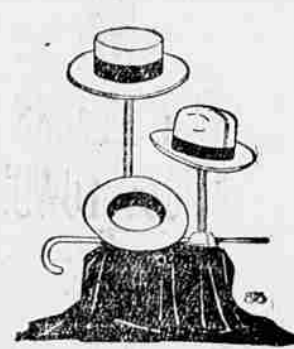
