N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—Trading in stocks today was again very active and uncertain of trend, representative issues making substantial recoveries while specialties continued to decline. Sales approximated 1,300,000 shares.

NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—Although prices were irregular at the outset of today's session, there were no traces of yesterday's violent reaction. Supporting orders stabilized the better known issues, especially rails, steels, equipments and motors with resultant gains ranging from fractions to 1 1/2 points. Oils were extremely erratic. Mexican Petroleum opening at a loss of two to three points regained partially later.

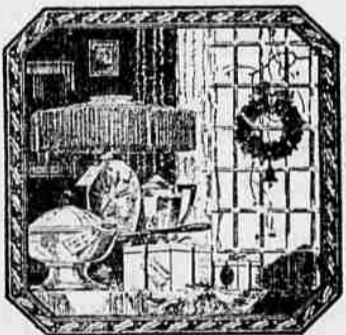
