DOG OWNERS ARE URGED TO SECURE LICENSES FOR 1921

Dog licenses for 1921 are payable to the county clerk on and after January 1, and owners of canines in both city and county, if they desire to retain the same, are urged to remit without delay. Last year over 1600 licenses were issued in this county, and it is expected there will be more this year.

The funds collected will be put into the dog fund, and if a farmer loses a sheep or goat thru the murderous attacks of a dog, he can file a claim with the county clerk, and be reimbursed. Several claims of this nature were filed with the county last year, and paid upon the presentation of satisfactory evidence.

The dog tax has created considerable local dissatisfaction among farmers, who think that country dogs should not be assessed, but city canines made to stand the tax, upon the argument that the city dog is of no use to the community, while the country dog is a terror for farmhands. An effort will be made in the legislature to have the law repealed.

CITY CHRISTMAS TREE CEREMONY ASHLAND TONIGHT

ASHLAND, Dec. 24.—A huge Christmas tree, nearly fifty feet high, is the fine evergreen growth which will be the landmark on the plaza in this city, at the Christmas observance of the community plan, Friday evening, Dec. 24, promptly at 6:30. The hour is an early one, in order to give those interested opportunity to attend Christmas exercises at their respective churches. The big tree is resplendent with vari-colored electric settings and presents an imposing appearance. The exercises will be brief, with addresses by Revs. Evans, Koehler and Smith, while Christmas carols will be the joyous musical accompaniments. This observance will not be confined to church members and Sunday schools, but the entire community is cordially invited to participate and make the event one of big proportions, enthusiastically inclined.

Fortunately, the holiday season witnesses the completion of the drive in this vicinity in behalf of the Children's Welfare Home, and it is needless to add that the community again "went over the top" in this praiseworthy object. Ashland's quota was a thousand dollars. The campaign lagged for a time due to unforeseen complications, but the results were attained just the same, an accomplishment which is all the more gratifying in the face of obstacles involved. The amount raised in this city will be over the \$1000. The understanding is that, provided \$125,000 is raised for this object throughout Oregon, the state will stand responsible in further backing the project.
