PARIS.—Lenine's attempt to rule and unite the socialists of the world and control their policies through the operations of the Third Internationale of Moscow is to be contested by the central party, or fraction of socialists. Their party occupies a middle position between the extreme right, or moderate faction of socialists and the extreme left, or radical faction. It was in order to organize their forces into a Fourth Internationale that a meeting of the Centrist Socialists of the world has been called in Vienna on February 22 next.
