## FROST EXPERT IS PROMOTED TO A POST IN IOWA

It is with much regret that the orchardists of the Rogue River valley learn that Floyd D. Young, the frost expert of the United States weather service and who had been stationed here in the early spring for several years during the frost period, has been promoted from his position with the Portland bureau to be in charge of the weather bureau at Davenport, Ia. The orchardists had every confidence in Mr. Young for his past splendid work here, and hope that his successor in frost work in this vicinity will prove to be as competent. Mr. Young entered the weather bureau 11 years ago and served first at Key West, then at San Francisco and then at Portland. He has done much to develop the work of forecasting frost, and to show how vegetation may be protected from frost, and is the author of a number of pamphlets and papers on the subject. Mrs. Young and their small son, who are visiting relatives in California, will probably join Mr. Young at Salt Lake, on their way east.
