GENERAL CALIBRE 1921 LEGISLATURE ABOVE AVERAGE

SALEM, Jan. 12.—(Special to Mail Tribune.) The legislature has commenced its forty-day grind with no serious upheavals in the immediate offing. Perhaps it is the calm which precedes the storm.

It seems to be the general impression of the older state house habitués that the average caliber of the present legislature is considerably better than usual and it should make a splendid record. The senate is largely a group of old-timers and men experienced in the legislative and political game and perhaps, because of that fact, pretty sharply divided into two groups which might be roughly classed as the group headed by President-elect Ritter and that headed by his competitor for that honor, Senator Eddy.

In the house, no lines of cleavage have been drawn as yet. Nearly two-thirds of the membership are brand new to legislative halls and the older members are kept busy showing them the ropes.

The Jackson county delegation, because its members are "old-timers," bids fair to take prominent parts in the forthcoming session. Senator Thomas, having been the opponent of the successful candidate for president, did not sit at the first table when the committee assignments were dished out, but still was pretty well cared for and is not complaining. Thomas' forte is a floor man rather than a committee worker, and no one who knows the situation doubts for a moment but that he will be heard from many times before the session adjourns. His most important committee assignment was that on revision of laws, but in addition to that his assignments to the committees on agriculture, railroads and the chairmanship of claims may be positions of unusual importance before the session is over.

Representatives Carter and Sheldon were both assigned to committees of particular interest to Jackson county and were both given chairmanships of committees handling important state-wide subjects. Carter being chairman of the committee on banking and Sheldon of the committee on education. Mr. Carter is also southern Oregon's representative on the roads and highways committee and a member of resolutions, while Sheldon is a member of the committees on irrigation and horticulture, both decidedly important to Jackson county.

Carter has also been assigned to the committee on legislation and Sheldon to the committee on railroads and transportation.

M'NARY WORKING FOR PROTECTION TO OREGON FRUIT

Senator Charles L. McNary wired the Oregon Growers Cooperative association January 11 as follows:

"Appeared before senate finance committee today and offered argument in favor of tariff five cents a pound on cherries in brine, walnuts and filberts. Committee took matter under advisement. Have strong hopes of cherries in bill as it comes out of committee. Should I fall before committee, will offer amendment on floor of senate."

This was in response to several telegrams to Senator McNary sent by the Oregon Growers Cooperative association, urging that in the proposed tariff bill before congress, a duty be placed on cherries and walnuts, as these industries of Oregon were threatened with disaster. Due to the low rate of exchange, Italy has been selling white cherries in brine in New York at seven cents a pound. To compete, this would mean about three cents a pound next season for Oregon growers.

The walnut industry is also threatened by imports from China and Japan the past season, as these Manchurian walnuts were selling at seven cents a pound wholesale. To compete with such a price would spell ruin to Oregon growers. China and Japan are shipping to this country, four times the amount of walnuts they did in 1919. Growers feel that unless something is done to prevent the importation of nuts from Japan, the industry will be in bad shape for several years.
