

ROGUE RIVER FISH BILL IS AMENDED FOR GRANTS PASS

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 18.—Three bills, providing for the creation of separate fish and game commissions and establishing regulations for the taking of fish from the Rogue river, have been formally approved by the fish and game commission and will go before the members of the state legislature with the unanimous endorsement of the commission.

A final meeting of the commission and the fish and game committees of the house will be held this afternoon to decide upon provisions of the code which will safeguard the interests of both commissions and in the words of one member of the commission, "settle for all time this question so that it will never be raised again, if that is possible."

The bills, as approved, are substantially the measure indorsed at a joint meeting held in Portland in November attended by representatives of the federal government, the commercial fishing interests and the sporting interests.

The bills, as approved, provide for the creation of a fish commission of three members and a game commission of five members, each appointed and removed by the governor.

The only change in the Rogue river bill was that regarding the date of opening the season at Grants Pass. The opening date at this point is to be May 25 instead of June 1, and the closing date October 1 instead of October 31. The season at the mouth of the Rogue river will extend from May 15 to October 1.

An amendment will be added to each bill in the committee providing that the attorney general will act as arbitrator in all controversies or differences that may arise between the new fish and game commissions and the old commission. The bills, reported out as committee measure will probably be passed tomorrow.
