

### AUTO CAMP GROUND LOCAL NEED: SAYS TOURIST EXPERT

Herbert Cuthbert, head of the Pacific Northwest Tourist association, addressed the regular Wednesday noon forum of the Chamber of Commerce at the Holland hotel today, and urged upon those present the value of the tourist trade, and called attention pointedly to the lack of an auto camping ground in this city.

"Thousands of vacationists pack up their autos every summer, with but one thought: To camp out. They never intend to stop at a hotel, and if they do not stop in Medford, where you have no auto camping ground, it is your fault, not the tourists'. Ashland has one of the finest camping grounds on the Pacific Coast, and the more credit to her," said Mr. Cuthbert.

"Southern Oregon has the climate and the scenery, and is next door to California, the playground of the union. Over a million dollars a day is spent in that state by tourists, and there is no reason why your section should not reap a harvest from people with plenty of money and no place to spend it," said Mr. Cuthbert.

The speaker gave figures showing how out of millions spent yearly by vacationists, the bulk of it went to Europe and Cuba, and those sections of the union where the business of securing and luring tourists to view the natural wonders was conducted along efficiency lines. He also told of the advertisements of the tourists association among prospective visitors to the Pacific coast, urging them to visit the northwest. "If the women of every community will help, the results will be beyond all dreams," said the speaker.

Miss Amy Smith, executive secretary of the Y. W. C. A., for the northwest told of the work of the organization during the war, and their future plans among the women of the world.

Mrs. A. J. Hanby acted as chairman of the meeting, which was largely attended.

Harvey L. Wither announced that the plans for the county fair next fall were proceeding expeditiously, and that after much red tape, all the papers had finally been signed.

Rev. Millard led the singing in his usual able manner, and introduced a couple of new numbers.

### LUCKY MEDFORD MUCH WORK AHEAD

The prediction that the year 1921 will be a prosperous one seems likely to be fulfilled. The last subscription to U. S. Treasury Certificates has been over-subscribed one hundred per cent, although the issue was over two hundred and fifty million dollars. Coincident with this comes the information that money has been offered in New York from interior banks on demand, at a rate lower than the regular market rate of six per cent.

It means that in all probability Jackson County will be able to sell her low interest bearing bonds, and that great activity will prevail here in the spring on account of road work and other improvements. Liquidation is apparently progressing satisfactorily elsewhere, and the Farmers and Fruitgrowers Bank is authority for the statement that prosperity will continue to prevail here.

### LUDWIG MARTENS AND FAMILY TO SAIL SATURDAY

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19.—Ludwig C. A. K. Martens, Russian soviet agent in this country, who recently was ordered deported, will be accompanied by 51 other Russians when he sails Saturday from New York on the Swedish-American liner Stockholm it was learned today.

With Martens will be his wife and two children and employees in this country of the Russian soviet government who have been recalled.

The soviet government is to pay for the transportation of all those in the party except Martens, whose expenses will be borne by the American government, as he has been ordered deported. Eighteen first-class cabins have been reserved for the party and it is said the transportation cost will be \$180 for each person, plus a war tax of \$8.

The Stockholm will dock at Gotham and the Russians will proceed to Esthonia and thence into Russia.

### SPARKS FROM THE WIRE

NOME, Alaska, Jan. 17.—(Delayed). Tom Ward, president and general manager of the Ward Cooper company of New York, was found frozen to death a few miles from Teller, Alaska, January 12, according to word reaching Nome today.

SPOKANE, Jan. 19.—The Spokane State bank, in an outlying business district, was held up by two unmasked men this afternoon who forced two bank employes and a customer into the vault and escaped in an automobile with a sum estimated at \$1000.

OAKLAND, Cal., Jan. 19.—Business houses in the heart of Oakland suffered a total damage of more than \$100,000 today when a 15-inch water main burst underground at a street intersection, flooding the basements of a score of buildings. A manhole top was shot many feet into the air by the sudden torrent of water and two large holes were torn through the paving.

JASPER, Ala., Jan. 19.—Indictments charging murder in connection with the lynching of William Hildt, a miner, near here last Thursday were returned today by a special grand jury against nine members of Company M, state militia, of Tuscaloosa county.

### NAVAL SEAPLANE IS SUNK BY GUN FIRE

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 19.—The naval seaplane NC-5 which was forced down and wrecked during a squadron flight from San Diego to Balboa, Canal Zone, has been "sunk by gunfire," according to a report received by the naval radio here today. No explanation of the message was received.

Naval authorities here believed that the NC-5 had become a menace to navigation as she was drifting in a coastwise steamer lane of Costa Rica and as a consequence was sent to the bottom by the guns of some naval vessel. Following her forced descent off the Gulf of Nocooya on January 16 her crew was taken aboard by the destroyer Mugford.

GALVESTON, Texas, Jan. 18.—Mrs. Edna Brown and M. S. Settle, both of Galveston and aged about 35, were shot to death here early today. Francis Brown, husband of the dead woman surrendered to officers.

Mrs. Brown, shot through the heart was lying in the seat of an automobile. The body of Settle, shot through the head, was found in the roadway.
