C. OF COMMERCE WORKS FOR FROST EXPERT'S SERVICE

At a meeting of the board of directors of the Medford Chamber of Commerce yesterday afternoon a number of citizens were called in consultation on legislative matters referred to the board by the Jackson county delegation at Salem.

Before going on record as either favoring or being opposed to text books, this was referred to the school board and the bills introduced re responsibility for money deposited in the Jacksonville Bank were passed to the county authorities for their opinion.

Resolutions were adopted showing the appreciation of southern Oregon to the Multnomah and Imperial Hotels of Portland for the splendid publicity being given to Crater Lake.

Telegrams were directed to be sent to the Oregon senators and representatives at Washington, urging them to use their influence with Chief Marvin of the Weather Bureau to assure the Rogue River Valley of the services of an observer during the frost period.
