NEARLY 10,000 ILLEGAL STILL CAPTURED 1920

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Jan. 28.—A total of 9,401 illicit stills were captured and 5228 arrests were made during the year 1920 in the southern prohibition district which comprises Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Kentucky, and Tennessee, according to figures made public today by S. R. Brame, supervising agent of the district. Prosecutions resulted in fines aggregating \$288,585 and imprisonments totalling 2378 months.

While testing out the Buick auto, Carol took the teacher on an auto ride, one day, and running out of funds for refreshments, stopped at the Austin Hotel in Ashland, and presented a check for \$50. The clerk told Carol, he would have to have somebody identify him, and he called in the school teacher from the new Buick and said to the clerk:
