

STANDARD OIL TO REDUCE WAGES BY STOPPING BONUS

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 2.—Voluntary reductions of wages among the 13,000 workers in the Standard Oil company of California on the Pacific coast are not expected as the wage awards here differed from those in New Jersey and elsewhere, company officials said today.

NEW YORK, Feb. 2.—The Standard Oil company of New Jersey and the Standard Oil company of New York today announced a reduction of one cent in the price of gasoline and kerosene. The former company's new wholesale gasoline price is 2 3/4 cents and the latter's 30 cents.

NEW YORK, Feb. 2.—Employees at all the refineries of the Standard Oil company of New Jersey have voluntarily accepted a reduction of one-half of their cost on bonus effective February 15, it was announced here today at the general offices of the company.

NEW YORK, Feb. 2.—Reports circulated here that the Standard Oil company was planning a ten per cent wage reduction in all parts of the United States were given added currency today by news of cuts made by Standard Oil subsidiaries in New Jersey and West Virginia.

Employees of the Bayonne and Bay Way (Elizabeth) plants of the Standard Oil company of New Jersey, considered the proposed reduction at meetings last night, while reports came from Mannington, W. Va., that employees of the Eureka Pipe Line company, a Standard Oil subsidiary, had been notified of a similar reduction.

In the West Virginia field a number of employees of the South Penn Oil company, also a Standard Oil subsidiary, have been laid off.

The proposed reduction, according to employees will take the form of suspension of a ten per cent wage bonus granted by the company during the war to offset high living costs.
