**EDUCATION FOR
BUSINESS MEN
IS EMPHASIZED**

It is just as necessary that the business man receive a university training as it is for the engineer, doctor, lawyer or dentist in order that he may have the benefit of the training which most business men have obtained by their own experiences. There are just as many well defined rules and regulations to the successful conduct of business affairs as there are in other professions, however these are subject to changes in economic conditions and for that reason the trained man is better equipped for success than the man who is in business and does not understand why certain changes become necessary. Such was the essence of the address of Dean Robbins of the School of Commerce of the University of Oregon at the Chamber of Commerce forum yesterday.

In the establishment of a new course of study for the training of secretaries of chambers of Commerce the Dean clearly showed that a secretary must understand city planning, must be posted on the changes of the economic conditions and understand the requirements for community leadership and therefore a school for secretaries of Oregon will be held during the Easter vacation period this year.

The forum was well attended and was presided over by Glenn O. Taylor, Rev. Millard again demonstrated his development as a song leader. Among the out of town guests were John Fuller of Ashland, Miss Suzanne Holmes of Jacksonville and W. F. Walker of Portland.

**NAME COMMITTEE
TO HANDLE JAP
PROBLEM HERE**

At a meeting of the board of directors of the Medford Chamber of Commerce held yesterday afternoon the reports of several committees covering legislative subjects were unanimously approved, and directed that the legislators at Salem be notified of the action taken.

The Japanese question received the attention of the board and the forum recommendation was unanimously approved. This calls for the appointment of a committee which shall have as its duty to confer with like committees of civic organization and the common council to consider the action to be taken immediately to head off the Japanese immigration to the Rogue River valley and their leasing and purchasing of lands, prior to the time when legislation could be enacted by the state.

Communications were directed to be sent to the Jackson county delegation at Salem and at Washington showing clearly the attitude of the residents of Jackson county upon the Japanese question.

The committee appointed consists of George T. Collins, chairman, J. W. Wakefield, Ralph W. Elden, A. C. Hubbard and B. Klum.

A proposition for the establishment of an apple syrup factory was referred to a committee consisting of C. C. Cate, chairman, E. J. Skewis and C. M. Kidd. No action will be taken by this committee until further data may be obtained as to the requirements necessary for the establishment of such a factory.
