

# ASHLAND DEFEATS HILL ACADEMY BY SCORE OF 28 TO 21

Hill's Military academy basketball five suffered defeat at the hands of the Ashland quintet last night on the Ashland floor in a 28 to 21 contest. The Hill bunch, composed of husky and clever basketeers, led the Ashlanders practically throughout the game in spite of the fact that they were unable to get going wide-open, and the Granite City boys carried off the honors only after coming to in the last ten minutes of play. Over-confidence, underestimation of the Ashland five and the small floor contributed to Hill's defeat and those who saw the game predict better work on their part when the academy men take a crack at the local high school squad tonight at the Nat. When the military boys get on a regulation floor they will undoubtedly show better form. Captain Goodrich, Hill's running guard is a whirlwind on the floor, a man who the local tossers will have to watch and who will help to give the Medford boys a hard run tonight.

# LOCAL JAPANESE WELCOME ACTION

M. Maru, steward of the University club, and the most influential Japanese in the valley, made a statement this morning in behalf of the local Japanese colony, setting forth that they too, deplored any invasion of the Rogue River valley by Japanese farmers, and that he would use his personal influence to prevent it.

Maru said that he had made an investigation of the situation, and found that two Japanese families had tried to lease land, and that the reports of scores coming was exaggerated and "not true." He also vigorously denounced any influx of coolie labor, as being alike detrimental to his own people, and Americans, and that the Japanese association would take action, and address resolutions to their consuls at Portland, San Francisco, protesting against any such invasion.
