JITNEY IS SIDE SWIPED BY S. P. FREIGHT TRAIN

In the daily near-tragedy on the Main street crossing of the Southern Pacific Friday noon, an interurban jitney running between this city and Ashland, was side-swiped by a freight train. The only occupants of the car were the driver and a passenger, and there was no damage, except a slight twist to the front axle. A crowd of 100 pedestrians waiting for the freight to pass got a thrill.

According to T. A. Flier, Crossing Watchman Harry Evans, and other eye witnesses, the driver of the car was too anxious to get across, and moved over to the wrong side of the road, turning between the cars before the crossing was clear. The train stopped suddenly and the "block" thrown back caught the car amidship, shunting it to one side. The jitney was headed west at the time of the accident.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4.—The recount of ballots in the Michigan senatorial election of 1918 finished recently by the senate elections committee left Senator Newberry, republican, with a plurality of 4334 over Henry Ford. Mr. Ford made a net gain of 3233 votes in the recount but Senator Newberry's original plurality was 7567.
