

JOHN BULL TO BE REAL BOSS JEWISH STATE

LONDON, Feb. 14.—The British draft of the mandate for Palestine which will be submitted to the council of the League of Nations at its next meeting in Geneva, provides that the mandatory nation (Great Britain) shall have all the powers inherent in the government of a sovereign state, according to the text of the draft, printed by the Jewish Chronicle here today.

Among the outstanding features of the twenty-seven articles of the mandate are stipulations that the widest measure of self government for localities, consistent with prevailing conditions, shall be encouraged and that the

mandatory shall be responsible for maintaining such political, administrative and economic conditions as shall secure the establishment of a Jewish national home and the development of self governmental institutions. The mandatory assumed the responsibility of seeing that no Palestine territory shall be ceded, leased or otherwise subjected to any foreign power; that Jewish immigration shall be facilitated; that the civil and religious rights of all the inhabitants, irrespective of race or religion, shall be safeguarded, and that there be no discrimination against the nationals of any states, members of the League of Nations.

Responsibility for taxation, commerce and navigation is vested in the mandatory. It is also provided that a land system be introduced to promote close settlement of the land and its intensive cultivation.

All responsibility in connection with the holy places, religious buildings and their sites are assumed by Great Britain.

GERMANS DENY ABILITY TO DUMP GOODS IN U. S. A.

BERLIN, Feb. 18.—Representatives of German export manufacturers at a meeting here today voted to memorialize the American governmental bodies dealing with tariff matters, setting forth present conditions among German working men and the German industries and supplying all available data on German production. This documentary matter is intended as an argument not only that there is no purpose on the part of Germany to dump cheap German wares on the American market, but that it would be impossible.

Exporters declared the workmen were highly paid and would work only six hours a day.

Committees were named to collect data from every important export industry for submission to America.
