# 8 MILLION FEET TIMBER RUINED BY JANY. STORM

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—Eight million board feet of timber was destroyed by the cyclone that ripped a 75 mile path, thirty miles wide, thru the forests of the Olympic peninsula, Washington state, January 29. Reports from the forest service made public today classed the storm as "the greatest disaster ever recorded in the annals of forestry and lumbering."

The wind registered 132 miles per hour before instruments at the weather bureau station were destroyed. It is estimated to have reached 150 miles thereafter. Virtually all standing timber over 2250 square miles went down in a tangled mass obliterating roads and telegraph lines and with little chance of salvage. Most of it was western hemlock and spruce, Acting Forester E. A. Sherman reported, and subject to rapid decay.

No human lives were lost but buildings were destroyed and many animals including elk, perished. Numbers of animals were penned in by the tangle of debris to die of hunger. The best winter feeding ground for elk of the region was swept.

"If fire should gain headway in the devastated area," the forester reported "the most stupendous conflagration ever known in this country would result. Fifteen billion feet (of timber) is exposed in the adjoining part of the Olympic national forest."

As special precaution against fire, the navy department has been asked to make an air survey of the storm area since it is impassable afoot. Re-equipment of the war-time spruce railroad, the only line of rails into the section has been asked of the war department in order to salvage as much timber as possible.

# ARGENTINE PAPERS EXPECT WILSON TO VETO TARIFF BILL

BUENOS AIRES, Feb. 18.—Veto of the Fordney tariff bill by President Wilson is forecast by the newspaper La Razon. Action by Argentina to offset the effects of the bill may be expected, the newspaper says should the president's veto be overridden. Congress has lost sight of the trade situation in South America it is asserted and ignored fundamental principles of economics.

"Should the bill become a law," the newspaper declares, "the moment of defense will have come for Argentina to initiate a policy parallel and similar to that which the Fordney measure seeks to implant."

BUENOS AIRES, Feb. 17.—Commenting on the passage of the Fordney bill in the United States senate, Dr. Romula Naon, former Argentine ambassador to the United States, informed La Nacion that he did not favor reprisals by Argentina if the measure became effective.

Dr. Naon declared there was no doubt that the commercial situation between the United States and Argentina would be made worse if the Fordney bill became effective. He blamed the Argentine government for not foreseeing such a measure would be undertaken by the republican party and negotiating a special commercial treaty with the United States which would forestall it.

# PORTO RICO ASKS UNCLE SAM FOR A BETTER GOVT.

SAN JUAN, Porto Rico, Feb. 17.—Claims of Porto Rico for a better form of government were included in dispatches sent today by the Porto Rican legislature to Horace M. Towner, chairman of the insular affairs committee of the United States house of representatives and Senator Albert B. Fall, chairman of the senate committee on Pacific Island, Porto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

The messages requested the congressmen to express to their respective houses the "sentiments of adherence and respect of the representatives of the people of Porto Rico for the representatives of the national sovereignty, looking for that justice worthy of both in the granting of our immediate aspirations in the extension and development of our present system of government under democratic principles."

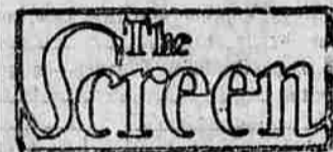
