HINES GRANTED CHANGE VENUE G. JURY MEETS

The grand jury convened at Jacksonville this morning, and began its deliberations after the usual procedure. No reports are expected for a day or so. The body will investigate several criminal matters, including the case of W. F. DeWitt, an Ashland jitney driver held responsible for an accident on the Pacific Highway, Christmas Eve, near Talent resulting in the death of Mrs. Nona Jennings of this city.

The grand jury is composed of the following citizens: H. C. Burgess, Orris Crawford, A. W. Boebe, Fred Copple, Dan Fowler, William Earhart, and James Campbell.
On the plea of attorneys for R. E. Hines that a change of venue be granted the court transferred two counts to be heard in Josephine county. The grounds were jurisdiction in this county against the defendant.
The court set down for the petit jury docket the Lark Evans case for the first one. Evans is charged with assault and robbery, and was granted a retrial by the supreme court on the grounds of new evidence. This is much local interest in this case.
In granting the plea for a change of venue to Josephine county for R. D. Hines, former vice president of the defunct institution, the court said it "was largely actuated by the belief that it would be only fair to this particular defendant, as well as less expensive to the county, for in the very nature of things many taxpayers will feel that they are personally aggrieved by the failure of the bank, and defendant would be justified in objecting to many jurors for that reason thus requiring the summoning of many jurors to secure a jury to try the case."
The court intimated that if similar pleas were received on behalf of other defendants he would transfer the case to other courts, so as not to congest any one trial calendar with the cases.

CHECK ARTIST IS HELD UNDER \$500 BAIL FOR HEARING

In Justice of the Peace Glenn O. Taylor's court this afternoon, George Robins, charged with passing a bad check for \$40 on Jens Jensen Saturday evening, was arraigned, and his preliminary hearing set for Wednesday, February 22, at nine o'clock in the morning. Bail was fixed at \$500 which friends are endeavoring to secure. He was represented in court by Attorney George M. Roberts.

Robins was arrested Saturday evening by William Ashpole and Sam Richardson of the Model Clothing company, after he had passed a forged check on Richardson for \$40, following the purchase of a \$2.50 necktie. Ashpole was in the store at the time, and followed Robins to the Economy Market, where he was trying to pass a check for \$40. As soon as he saw Ashpole, Robins made a hurried exit. By this time Mr. Richardson had become suspicious, and with Ashpole followed Robins, overtaking him in front of Hubbard Brothers. Robins, however, did not stop to talk until he reached the Nat.

After a short conversation Robins agreed to return the money, with Ashpole acting as the intermediary. Accordingly Richardson took the forged check in Ashpole's hands, and the money was returned by the same route. As soon as Robins got a hold of the check, according to the two businessmen, he tore it up with the remark: "There is your evidence."
Immediately afterwards Robins told the two a hard luck story, and promised to reform, if nothing was said, and swore that he had passed but one check. He was held in conversation until Policeman Adams arrived.

Before Robins cashed the check on the Model Clothing company, he passed one for the same amount on Jens Jensen, and tried to cash a check at the Medford Cigar store. Robins has been employed by Architect Frank Clark as a plasterer, and he was given a check for \$15, signed by Clark. He cashed this at the Toggery, paying a \$13 bill out of it.
The arrested man is about 27 years old, and claims Cincinnati, Ohio as his home.

just crossed over this stretch before the flood came, and proceeded to just south of the ice plant where it had to stop because the tracks were covered with water at this point, which had torn eight lengths of rails loose. Thus the freight train was narrowed between the two track breaks and could not be released until the railroad wrecking crew had repaired the track.
The flood coursed northward from Vorhies crossing, following the ditch beside the railroad embankment until it was stopped by the blocking up of the culvert near the ice plant where it again accumulated with sufficient force to wash out the tracks.
Both sections of passenger train No. 64 were held at Ashland until the track breaks were repaired and the first section did not reach Medford until long after 8 o'clock. The Kolb & Dill company was on the second section with its baggage and scenery. Hence it was nearly 10 p. m. before last night's performance was started. The very large audience however waited patiently, being entertained by the company's jazz orchestra.

It was reported today that at one home between the ice plant and Vorhies crossing 100 chickens were lost when the flood floated the poultry house away.
The south side of West Main street as usual when it rains heavy was in a badly flooded condition from curb to street car track and small lakes formed at the street intersections on the south side of the street, as far as Laurel street.
Antos ran almost hub deep in a number of streets of the city.
Residents of the Riverside apartments could only reach home in autos which drove through the flooded street and enabled them to jump out onto the sidewalk. This was the case also with many other people in other parts of the city.

to the indictments for throwing games. Representative Gard, democrat, Ohio wanted Mr. Welby to get down to brass tacks on his charge that Judge Landis had neglected his official duty.

Acceptance by Judge Landis of \$12,500 annual salary as supreme arbiter of baseball, might go unchallenged "if the motive back of it were not so apparent," Representative Welby had declared.
Calling attention to the action of the supreme court of the District of Columbia in assessing damages of \$240,000 against the big league baseball associations in suits brought under the anti-trust laws, and the indictment of players in Chicago for throwing games, he said:
"While these matters were pending in the courts, this illegal trust made Judge Landis its chief arbiter. And why should they select a federal judge as umpire? Was it because they wanted to tell the people 'we are not an unlawful trust because Landis is at our head?' Was it because these baseball magnates wanted to create a favorable sentiment with the hope that the supreme court of the District of Columbia would be reversed?"
