HARDING'S CABINET.

HARDING'S tentative cabinet is a study in black and white. Daugherty leads the black brigade, and Hoover the white, but the composition as a whole should be a pleasant surprise to those liberal Republicans, who with the nomination of Harding at Chicago, buried their progressive hopes in a sea of tears.

It was inevitable the cabinet should represent a compromise, just as it was inevitable at Chicago, that the nominee should represent a compromise, for the Republican party as at present constituted, is essentially a compromise.

In Hughes, Hoover, Hays, Mellon, Weeks and Wallace, over half of the cabinet fairly represents the principle, which has been stressed since Harding's election,—that the highest ability and statesmanship available should surround Harding in the next four years.

The standards and attainments of Hughes, Hoover, Weeks and Wallace are well known. Hays represents that rare type, a politician thoroughly drilled in the school of practical politics, and yet a man of keen intelligence, high ideals, and enlightened vision. A. W. Mellon, a banker of Pittsburg, selected for the treasury post, is not so well known, but his record is most promising. A financial expert, founder of the Mellon Institute of Industrial Research, he has been identified for many years with charitable and welfare work of the best type, and can be depended upon to bring breadth, vision and courage to this important cabinet place.

The only weak appointment, in our judgment, is Daugherty, plainly the payment of a dubious political debt, and while one must respect the courage and loyalty which prompted it, there is ground for genuine apprehension that Daugherty may prove to be as troublesome to Harding as Ballinger was to Taft and Bryan was to Wilson. It is rumored he won't last long, that his appointment has been forced upon Harding, by the fact that non-recognition would be considered in Ohio, as repudiation. That sounds likely. Certainly this place could be readily filled, by any one of a dozen men, far superior in character and attainments.

Over the selection of Senator Fall there promises to be little enthusiasm. For while his character and ability are unquestioned, his name has become so linked with industrial reaction and imperialism in Mexico, that the people of the west will view his selection with disapproval, mingled in many quarters with distrust.

J. J. Davis also of Pittsburg, was born in Wales, came to this country when four years of age and started to earn his own living at eleven, as a puddler in the steel mills. In 1906 he was chosen to reorganize the Moose lodge of which he is now the head, is a member of the Amalgamated Association of Iron and Steel workers and always has been active in union affairs. This cabinet position has become of such importance in the last few years, and promises to be of such increasing importance in the years to come, that a man like Mr. Davis, whose capacity for big affairs, has been so slightly tried, represents hope, rather than faith, to be mingled by just minds with clarity.

The final choice and the surprise of the cabinet is the selection of Edward Denby of Michigan, as secretary of the navy. Mr. Denby has never been prominent politically outside of his state, but has actual war service in the army and navy to his credit, was congressman for three terms and member of the naval committee has an intimate knowledge of conditions in China and Japan and it is not improbable he will prove one of the coming men of the Harding administration.

All in all, the cabinet, under the circumstances is a good one,—certainly far above the average,—and as now constituted holds promise of satisfying the popular hope of a return to a properly co-ordinated and efficient administration at Washington.

9—Of what tribe of Indians was Black Hawk chief? Ans. He was chief of the Sac and Fox tribe.

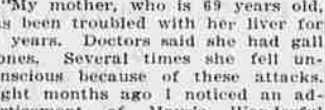
10—How long is the Gulf of California? Ans. It is about 700 miles long.

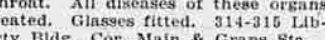
