**REVIVAL SERVICE
ASHLAND CHURCH
ATTRACTS CROWDS**

ASHLAND, Mar. 2.—The evangelistic movement at the Methodist church is now at its crest, carrying a peak load of enthusiasm connected with the experiencing of religious conviction under most auspicious circumstances. The local pastor, Rev. C. A. Edwards, is reinforced by Dr. Bennett, noted as a foremost worker in the evangelistic field, also others who devote both time and talent in behalf of the forward religious movement incorporating exhortation, persuasion and song. Interested co-workers from other towns in the valley are participating. Last Friday nearly a hundred young people from Grants Pass were present, who upon arrival were greeted by the good women of the congregation, afterwards joining in a "preparation service," preliminary to the evening program, when the assembly assumed the proportions of an old fashioned revival gathering. Musical accompaniments were augmented by a massed choir approximating fifty voices, and in connection with the service of exhortation and song, the airs of grand familiar hymns echoed their refrain on the "Tell Me the Old, Old Story" basis. The altar service on Sunday was a notable evidence of scores pledging themselves to the new life as reflected in consecrated effort, by way of contrast to prevailing indifference heretofore regarding spiritual matters, and nominal Christians, as well, were quickened in their zeal for the Master's work.

**E. H. HURD WRITES
MAGAZINE ARTICLE
UPON FARM LOAN**

The following contribution is written by E. H. Hurd, who is now delegate from Oregon to the National Union of Farm Loan associations, and which article was written for the March issue of the National Farmers Magazine, Washington, D. C., which article is along the lines of an amendment now pending before congress.

The National Farm Loan System—How to make it more effective in service to the farmers?

Let the farm loan board order the Land Bank to proceed at once to operate in the matter of making new loans, appeal to congress for the immediate repeal of that part of the amendment to sec. 4 of the Farm Loan Act, which suspended indefinitely the representation of stockholders-borrowers in the Land banks by electing six directors in each land bank, provide blanks and instructions to the Land banks to receive deposits, through the farm loan associations as provided in this act, which deposits bear 4 percent and are convertible into Farm Loan bonds. Proceed to sell farm loan bonds on the open market, not through syndicates, but by a campaign of education and sales through all free and interested agencies, through farm organizations, at par, without commission or expense other than publicity and the actual expense of selling same.

Strengthen the act by raising the maximum of loans to \$25,000. Amend section 12, par. 5 to read as follows: "No such loan shall exceed sixty-five per centum of the value of the land mortgaged and fifty per centum of the value of the permanent, insured, improvements thereon, said value to be ascertained by appraisal, as provided in section ten of this act. In making said appraisal the value of the land for agricultural, horticultural and grazing or stock raising purposes shall be the basis of appraisal and the earning power of said land shall be principal factor."

That the following paragraph be added to section 11 of the Act.

Fifth: To obtain for members, under rules and regulations of the Farm Loan Board, sums of money in moderate amounts, in addition to any moneys on hand, to loan to its members, for productive purposes only, for reasonable periods and for reasonable rates of interest.

The Farm Loan Act, up to the time of its suspension March 1st, 1920, was of inestimable value to the great northwest as it made farm loan rates there as low as in the states of Ohio, Iowa and the middle west.

The great machinery for its development has been placed—the National Farm Loan association—let us preserve these associations, through state and national organizations, such as the Oregon Association of Farm Loan associations, and the National Union of Farm Loan associations.

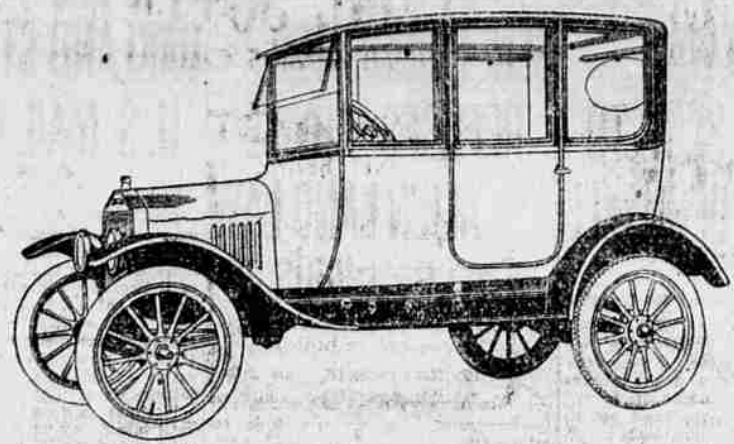

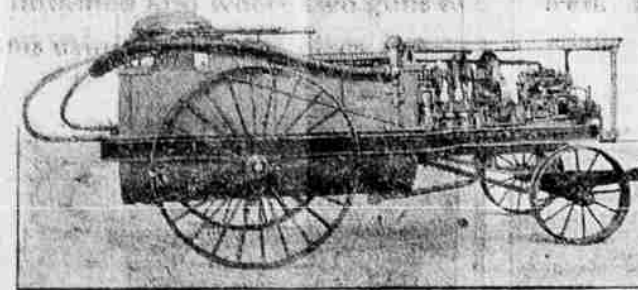
