CHICAGO, Mar. 8.—Rains benefiting crops had only a transient effect as a bearish factor on the wheat market today. Opening prices, which varied from unchanged figures to one cent lower, with March \$1.67 to \$1.67 1/2 and May \$1.58 1/2 to \$1.59 were followed by rallies to above yesterday's finish and then something of a reaction, nullifying most of the gain.
Corn, after opening unchanged to quarter lower, including May at 70 1/2 to 70 3/4 c then rose slightly above yesterday's close.
Oats, starting a shade off to 3/4 c advance, May 45 1/2 to 45 3/4 c, kept at about the same range.
Higher quotations on hogs gave firmness to provisions.

NEW YORK, Mar. 8.—The more ominous aspects of the foreign situation, as indicated by the weakness of international remittances, gave impetus to the further depreciation of stock market prices today. Sales approximated 450,000 shares.

NEW YORK, Mar. 8.—All foreign exchange rates in the local market today were adversely affected by the failure of the reparations conference and the invasion of Germany by French troops.

Demand bills on London fell to \$3.85 1/2 or nearly five cents from yesterday's final quotation.
The French rate of \$6.99 for demand bills showed a decline of 20 points.

Dutch remittances fell 15 points and the German marks at 1.52 showed a loss of 13 points.
