HOOVER VERSUS HERCULES.

HERBERT HOOVER promises to have his hands full. For the supreme problems of the Harding administration are to be economic problems, and the former food administrator is the one man in the cabinet best qualified to solve them.

For that is the essential problem, bringing order out of chaos, returning eggs that have been scrambled, into the market-basket of a steady and profitable production. To accomplish this feat, will require the wisdom of a Solomon, combined with the prestidigitating skill of a Hermann the Great.

Take the present railroad situation for example. A general reduction in wages has been announced which is all right as far as it goes. But it is going farther. With unskilled labor out of the way skilled labor will be attacked.

Unless all precedents are disregarded, the latter reduction means a fight. The railroads will then be faced by this dilemma,—how to reduce rates to satisfy essential business interests on one hand, and keep up wages to satisfy labor on the other.

Some will say don't satisfy labor. But then comes the question of efficient service. This is a commodity under labor control. How can the railroads of this country give efficient service, if the men running the railroads refuse to give it, because of general discontent.

And so on and so forth. The tariff is the next step. The farmers and manufacturers have been promised a high protective tariff. So far, so good, but again one must go farther. Europe owes this country something like ten billions. Obviously Europe can't pay in cash, it must pay, therefore in goods.

How can a tariff wall keep foreign goods out, and at the same time, allow foreign goods in? Or shall the ten billion debt be written off, and the high tariff written on?

And so on and so forth again. The more one looks into the economic situation in this country, which is far better than the economic situation anywhere else, the more one is inclined to close the think-tank shop and go fishing. But they can't go fishing in Washington. That's the tragedy of it. For four years now they must eat bait. And so it looks like a busy season indeed, for the Harding administration and particularly for Mr. Hoover.
