Every person, firm, co-partnership, company or corporation residing on, owning, leasing, occupying, possessing or having charge of or dominion over any land, building, wharf or dock in Jackson county, Oregon, is hereby notified to begin at once to effectively exterminate and destroy all such DIGGER GROUND SQUIRRELS.

- Barley, clean grain 16 quarts
strychnine (powdered alkaloid) 1 ounce
Bicarbonate of soda (baking soda) 1 ounce
Thin starch paste 3/4 pint
Heavy corn syrup 1/2 pint
Glycerine 1 tablespoonful
Saccharine 1-10 ounce

This material should be mixed as follows: Mix thoroughly 1 ounce of powdered strychnine (alkaloid) and 1 ounce of common baking soda. Sift this into 3/4 pint of this hot paste and stir to a smooth creamy mass.

From the date hereof until May 1st is the most effective time to poison and destroy the digger squirrels, as they are just emerging from their hibernation. They are hungry and food is scarce.

The County Court of Jackson County, Oregon has secured a large amount of strychnine and the other ingredients necessary for the mixture, and a quantity thereof has been mixed and is now on sale to the farmers or persons interested at actual cost and may be had by applying to the undersigned at his office in the Liberty Building or at the following places:

NO ENTHUSIASM IN GERMANY FOR RETURN OF KAISER

BERLIN—The King's Party in Germany, which is seeking the restoration of the monarchy, has failed to arouse any enthusiasm either for the proposal to put a Hohenzollern again in power or for the endorsement of a Bavarian or Wurttemberg prince.

Opinion seems to prevail that the revolution against the old regime, brought on by the debacle of war cannot be wiped out in less than several generations. Even the men who stood close to royalty before and during the war, with the exception of certain military whose prestige and influence mostly has vanished, are only lukewarm toward the monarchist movement or flatly oppose it.

There is, however, no apparent inclination to blame the former emperor or crown prince for the damage Germany has endured, except among the extreme radicals and some of the socialists, and these generally lay the fault to the old form of government more than to the emperor personally, or to his associates.

Everywhere in the provinces, throughout Bavaria, Baden, Wurttemberg, East Prussia, Upper Silesia, among business men and peasants alike, the opinion is firmly held that Germany was forced into the war by England and France, and this has tended to keep alive the Hohenzollern popularity.

A prominent Bavarian manufacturer told the correspondent the "Bavarians will always believe the war was forced on Germany." Business men in Baden, formerly owners of Upper Silesia, officials and farmers of East Prussia with whom the correspondent spoke, confirmed the prevalence of this feeling that Germany was not responsible for the war.

"Regardless of this belief, however, the Germans are not ready to restore a monarchy," said a man who was closely associated with the emperor during the war. "Perhaps in 40 or 45 years, yes, then it will almost certainly be re-established. You say you have heard the opinion that Germany will have a monarchy within 10 years, but I believe that is not possible. Not before at least two generations have passed will the people be ready for a king again, and then never for a monarch with great power. It will be a limited monarchy and very limited. Agitation now is untimely, and useless."

Those who favor the restoration of the monarchy, and those who believe it will be restored but do not favor it, say the present government is too weak and there is no responsible head who can unify Germany as it was before the war. The people, who were long accustomed to royalty, "need a directing social head if not a powerful monarch," it is argued and such a ruling house would not destroy the principle of democracy, which has been grounded since the war.
