The reason for the advice is not that I do not think your photograph attractive, but you are not a very distinct type, and nowadays casting directors who have the awarding of the minor parts to aspiring moving picture actors are looking only for types.

I am sure the "No" would seem kind if you could sit in my office for a few hours, watching the continual stream of people come in, and seeing those that are selected for extra work. Little babies in their mothers' arms, children, young men and women, middle aged and old people, all come filling in a steady line.

Today, for instance, we are looking

only for "beards." There is a scene in Thomas Meighan's new picture, "The Frontier of the Stars," that calls for a crowd of tenement people, including many bearded old men, to sit in bath tubs.

There is no youth and beauty requirement there, you see, though any bearded old man, who because of that reason sold his shop and came here to get into moving pictures would not be at all wise.

It is sometimes hard when a very old man, incapable of any work more strenuous than posing comes hoping for the twentieth time, having heard of some old man scene to be taken, to have to refuse him, perhaps for the reason his face is too clean and kindly, and the scene calls for a group of old reprobates.

On the other hand, it is almost a pleasure to refuse some people. A man ideally suited for the part of an Irish policeman, for instance, calls up and demands angrily to know why he was not sent for when a certain society scene was taken.

Types govern everything, you see. Whether it is the too determinedly shy young girl who pauses coyly in the doorway with downcast eyes, or whether it is the hardened old actor who marches resolutely up to the rail, and leaning over it, attempts confidential conversation.

It is not easy to get into the movies, and it is very, very hard to become a star. So, as I say, unless you are prepared for probable years of struggle and possible ultimate disappointment, I should advise your keeping the shop that provides, if not very much excitement, at least a steady income.

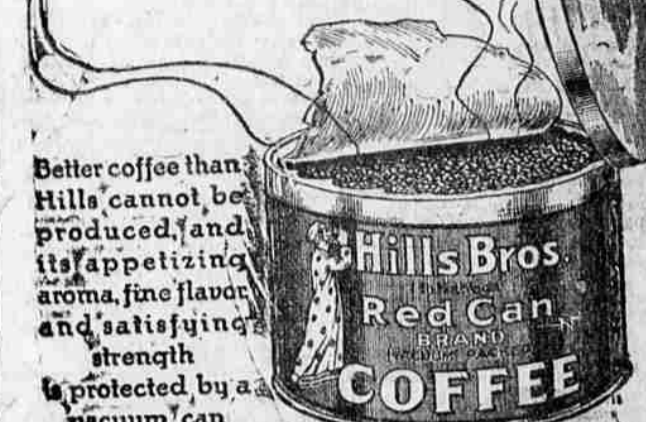
