CHICAGO, Mar. 21.—Buying on the part of houses with seaboard connections gave the wheat market a decided upward swing today. Indications pointed to considerable export business and country offerings were light. Opening prices which varied from unchanged figures to 1 1/2c higher with March \$1.53 to \$1.53 1/2 and May \$1.42 to \$1.43 1/2, were followed by sharp gains all around.

Corn after opening unchanged to a shade higher scored a moderate general advance.

Oats started 1/4 to 1/2 and 3/4 higher May 4 1/4 to 4 1/2c and then hardened still more.
