Viscount Uchida, foreign minister declared in the house of peers here today.

ROME, March 23.—Feeling against the Russian commercial delegation at present in this city is running high at the hotel where members of the party are staying. At dinner last night a French engineer, for many years a resident of Russia, asked M. Vorovsky, head of the delegation, in a loud voice, how the Russians got the treasures found by customs authorities in their baggage when they arrived. These treasures have been turned over to the director of customs.
