

### MEDFORD ENJOYS BEST MILK IN STATE, MELTON

Medford milk production is among the highest. It not higher in quality and butterfat contents than in any other locality in the state (not 5 to 5 1/2 per cent butterfat) but 4.4 per cent as sold to the consumer. This is a much heavier test than required under the state law, 2.2 per cent being legal. Mr. E. L. Melton, and W. B. Duncan, deputy dairy and food commissioners have just completed a rigid inspection of all dairies both in the city and those outside whose milk is used by the creamery or sold at retail. We have found and corrected many unsanitary conditions in and about the dairies. In all cases we have been received by the highest degree of courtesy with a willingness to cooperate with, and comply with, instructions given in reference to more sanitary surroundings and a better production of milk. We wish at this time to compliment the citizens of Medford for the splendid sanitary conditions which we have found in and about the food establishments here. We also wish at this time to thank the business men of this city for their courteous, splendid and immediate cooperation in our work.

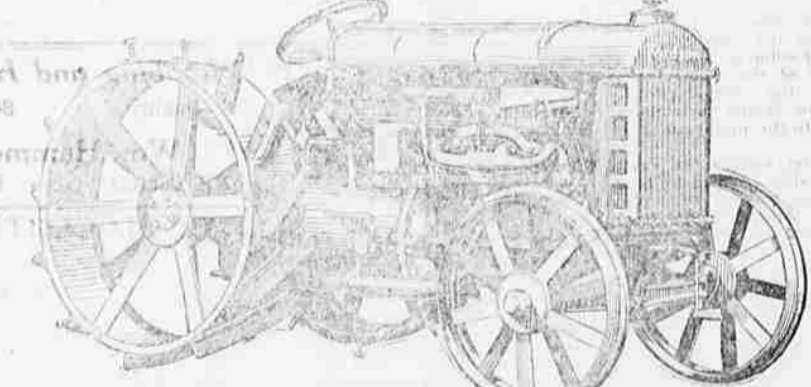
