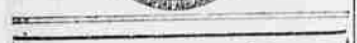

JAMES STILLMAN has an odd idea of protecting his father's memory. His attorney in explaining public divorce action, declared such protection was the fundamental motive.

Mr. Stillman may be strong on finance, but he is certainly weak on logic. If he wished to protect his father's name, washing the family's dirty linen in public was the last method to secure it.

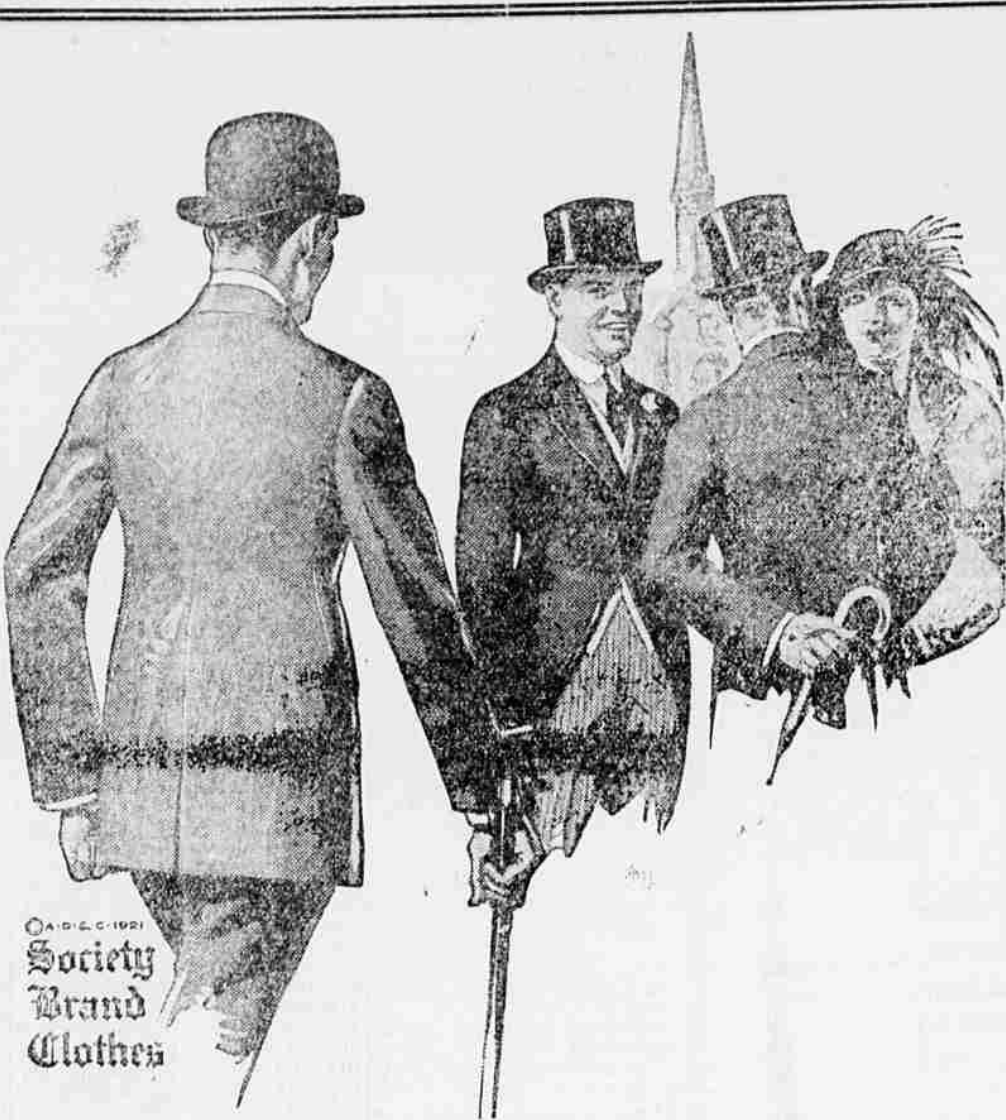

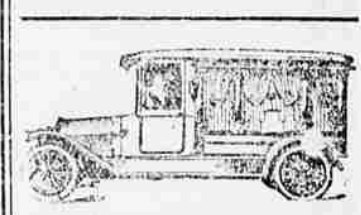
