U. S. LEADERSHIP OF THE WORLD.

THERE is a master at the helm. Secretary of State Hughes' note to the world powers decisively demonstrates the fact. Although at this writing the text of the note has not been announced, its general nature is fairly well indicated. Not as a hermit nation, withdrawing from world affairs, but as an independent nation, dominating them, is this emanation of a new United States policy to be regarded.

Secretary Hughes follows his predecessor's policy regarding the Island of Yap, but he goes farther than Colby, for he denies the validity of the League of Nations covenant, as far as this nation is concerned and he formally declares no international settlement will be regarded as final, to which this country is not a party.

Small wonder that Paris finds this pronouncement a grave one. It is grave, for it is, from an international standpoint, revolutionary. It marks the end of American diplomatic subservience to Europe and with one bold stroke, elevates the United States to the position of world leadership.

A year ago such a departure would not have been conceivable. But a great deal has happened since April, 1920. In the first place, unity among the allies has vanished. Underneath the surface of apparent harmony, France and England are at the parting of the ways. Italy is going it alone, and Japan is making hay until the clouds of European confusion, again allows the sun to shine.

Because of this, embarrassment formerly involved in independent leadership by America, has vanished. Even a separate peace with Germany, drawn so as to sacrifice no American privileges, is possible. For such action was well prepared by Hughes' former declaration, that in America's opinion Germany was responsible for the war, and must be made to pay for it.

So the Fates of Destiny have thus far worked well for the Harding administration, and the United States is indeed fortunate to have in the Department of State a man with the keen intelligence, insight and courage, to see American opportunity and take advantage of it.

What this latest diplomatic move at Washington means, in brief, is this,—a clearing of the tables in European council chambers, a new deal in statesmanship and the United States the final arbiter. What such a responsibility will involve, only the future can determine. But this much is certain,—Uncle Sam has burned the bridges of isolation behind him, he has crossed the Rubicon,—he is starting on a great adventure, with world hegemony as the goal.

of taken by the supreme council of the League of Nations. He asserts that this is a grave attitude on the part of the United States.

It was learned in official circles today that while the communication books previously upon the subject of the League of Nations last December in approving this matter, passed upon at that meeting in London, the Japanese minister, the secretary, Pacific states, looking to the Island of Yap, it has indicated the policy of the new administration regarding questions arising from the war and declares the approval of the United States to be necessary for a final settlement.

Very Night of Veno.
