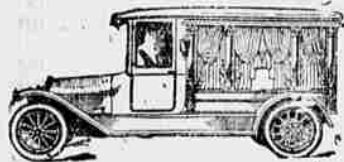

**ANNUAL MEETING**  
**C. OF COMMERCE**  
**TOMORROW NIGHT**

The annual meeting of the Medford Chamber of Commerce will be held at the public library at 8 o'clock tomorrow evening. A review of the work of the chamber will be made known by H. L. Walther who served in the capacity of president during the past year. Side lights on interesting situations during the past year will be brought to light and suggestions as to future activities will be welcomed by the board.

The forum luncheon on Wednesday noon will be held as usual. This will take place at the Medford Hotel and Adjutant General George A. White of Salem will address the members on the procedure necessary to secure the construction of the armory in Medford.

Members of Company D have the privilege of attending the forum extended to them.

The supplementary membership campaign will open with a "Good Fellowship Dinner" on Monday evening, April 18 at which Jake Allen of San Francisco will make the principal address. The final announcement as to where the dinner will be held will be made tomorrow.

The board of directors adopted the "Pay As You Go" plan of campaign which not alone calls for the team workers to get new members, but also to collect in advance the dues from the present membership and such dues and budget subscriptions as should have been paid prior to the first of this month.

The team workers will be given cards of three different colors. The blue card will be for the members who have not as yet paid dues in advance. The white card will show the names of prospective members who will be asked to become members and to pay some part of their dues in advance. The third card will be of a different color having the names of those members who now owe the chamber for dues or budget subscriptions.

All members of the Chamber of Commerce will be sent a statement of their account before the campaign starts in order to give them a chance to pay according to the "Pay As You Go" plan. Such payments will relieve the team workers of considerable of their work and give them a greater amount of time to secure new members.

Members of the Chamber of Commerce are entering into the campaign with a greater enthusiasm than ever before and this is due to their faith in the organization and their knowledge of a businesslike administration as shown by the annual report for the past fiscal year.

The real estate men of Jackson county met at the Medford Hotel Monday noon for luncheon. The purpose of this meeting was to formulate plans for an organization. There were present at this luncheon, Fred O. Brockman of Portland, secretary of the Inter State Realty association, C. V. Johnson of Salem, Ore., manager of the real estate department of the insurance commissioner's office, H. S. Hudson of Portland, business manager of the Artisans lodge of Portland.

Mr. Lindsay of Medford, presided at the luncheon and very interesting remarks were made by the guests. There were present from Ashland, Messrs. Staples, Billings, Weaver, Anderson and Conover. From Medford, Messrs. Brown, Hurd, Lindsay, Dressler, Farrell Wakefield, French, Page, Gould, West-

terland, Janney, Probaum, Everhard, Bennett, Mrs. Hayes and others.

The meeting adjourned until 8 o'clock in the evening when they re-assembled at the Medford hotel camp meeting a temporary organization, electing Mr. J. W. Dressler chairman, Mrs. F. E. Hayes, secretary, and a committee on bylaws consisting of Mr. Billings of Ashland, A. O. Bennett of Medford, J. W. Wakefield of Medford.

This meeting adjourned to meet in Ashland two weeks from last night, April 25th at 8 o'clock at the Austin hotel, to complete a permanent organization. All licensed realty dealers of Jackson county are urged to attend this meeting.

The object of this organization is to further all interests pertaining to the real estate business, to plan to act as an organization in civic matters and all things pertaining to the best welfare of the different sections of Jackson county, to perfect methods of co-operation and function in accord with the new state law, through the real estate department of the insurance commissioner's office at Salem. Practically all of the counties of the state of Oregon are organized at the present time under the same plan which is contemplated for this district, it being

generally conceded and understood that these organizations are of great benefit to the sections where located, not only in elevating and maintaining in general a fuller co-operation between officers, but of material benefit to the owners of property. Similar organizations in other sections of Oregon have made wonderful progress and the results have been most satisfactory to the people in general of those districts.

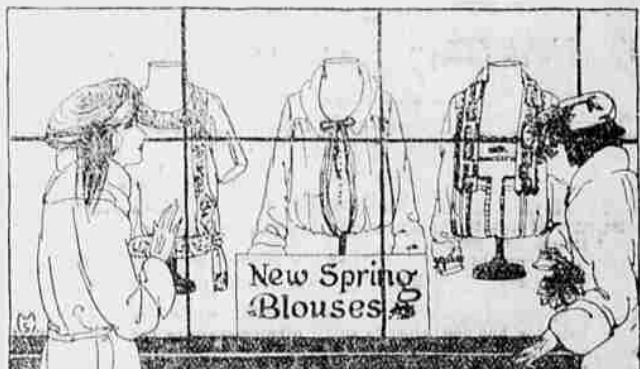

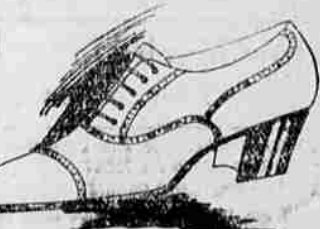
