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JOIN THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE.

THE Medford Chamber of Commerce has made good. Since its re-organization it has justified the hopes of its most sanguine supporters. It has actually come to be, in a marvellously short time, a genuine clearing house for local activities, and now occupies a place of usefulness in the community, which no other organization can fill, and which no similar organization has ever filled.

The accomplishments of the past year have been published before and need no repetition now. But greater than any specific accomplishment is the nature of the organization itself. By this we mean the administrative framework, which renders increasing accomplishment inevitable.

This administrative framework is built upon two outstanding essentials,—first efficiency and second democratic control. Efficiency is secured by placing the burden of responsibility upon a few,—the board of directors and executive officers,—and democratic control by placing the ultimate power in the hands of the membership, where it should be.

The great defect in former organizations of this kind has been the habit of allowing the power to gradually drift into a few hands, thus leading to a gradual alienation of the membership and finally to disorganization and the collapse of morale.

But since reorganization, the Medford Chamber of Commerce, has been an absolutely democratic organization, the directors selected by popular vote, and through the weekly forums, criticisms, suggestions and proposals allowed an absolutely free and untrammelled medium of individual expression.

In other words, one member of the organization has been given just as much power in determining the policies of the organization as another, and the consequent health and vigor of the chamber is much more important, than any particular accomplishments could possibly be.

A drive for new members opens tomorrow. No individual, man or woman, active in the business life of the community, can afford to stay out of the Chamber of Commerce. It isn't so much a question of civic loyalty as of plain matter-of-fact self-interest. The Chamber of Commerce represents an investment, which as long as it maintains its present policies, returns dividends to every resident of the city, not only in improved social and economic conditions, but in dollars and cents.

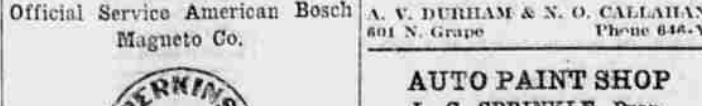
