**EXHIBITS WANTED OREGON PRODUCTS WEEK IN VALLEY**

In order to stimulate the purchase of Oregon-made products by Oregon people, the week of April 24 to 30 has been set aside for making displays of Oregon manufactured products in the show windows of Medford merchants.

No greater prosperity can be brought to our state than to keep our industries in full operation during 12 months of the year.

No greater prosperity can be brought to Jackson county than to have residents purchase Jackson county products, and in order that they may know the products manufactured here, you are invited to exhibit your manufactured wares at the exhibit room of the Medford Chamber of Commerce.

Exhibits should be put in place next Saturday, April 23rd, or Monday, April 25th, at the latest.

Exhibits should consist of flour mill and lumber mill products, box shoes, dairy goods, canned and dried fruits and vegetables, art goods, photographs, furniture, machinery, ice, printed matter, advertising signs, granite and cement products, tents and awnings, furs, candles, orchard ladders, fish screens, harness, men's and women's clothing, millinery, bakery goods, brooms, cigars, soft drinks, green house flowers, and any other products manufactured in the county. (Only those products which are actually manufactured in the county should be displayed.)

Each exhibit should have a small, neat sign giving the manufacturer's name, together with such other information as may be desired.

**ARMY PLANE IS FORCED TO LAND AT ROGUE RIVER**

Of three government airplanes, which passed over the city at 3:30 Wednesday afternoon en route from Mather field to Camp Lewis, the two piloted by Lieutenant G. Gardner and Sergeant Eckerson were forced to return to Medford, landing at the aviation field at 4:40 on account of the heavy clouds over the Umpqua divide, and the third plane piloted by Sergeant Andert, was forced to make a landing in a field 12 miles north of Rogue River because of engine trouble.

The planes, which are to act as target practice observers at Camp Lewis, expected to continue on their journey this forenoon, although before leaving the Hotel Medford this morning Lieutenant Gardner said that unless Sergeant Andert's motor was working perfectly he would not permit him to fly with his plane, and in this event he and Sergeant Eckerson would continue the flight to Camp Lewis without him. The lieutenant did not know the condition of Andert's motor after the latter had landed.

The planes flew to Medford from Red Bluff in two hours yesterday afternoon, bucking a rather strong wind most of the way. They left Mather field at 10:30 a. m., arrived at Red Bluff, where they stopped to take on gas and oil, and departed from Red Bluff at 1:30 p. m.

**CITY CUTS DOWN OAKDALE CORNER**

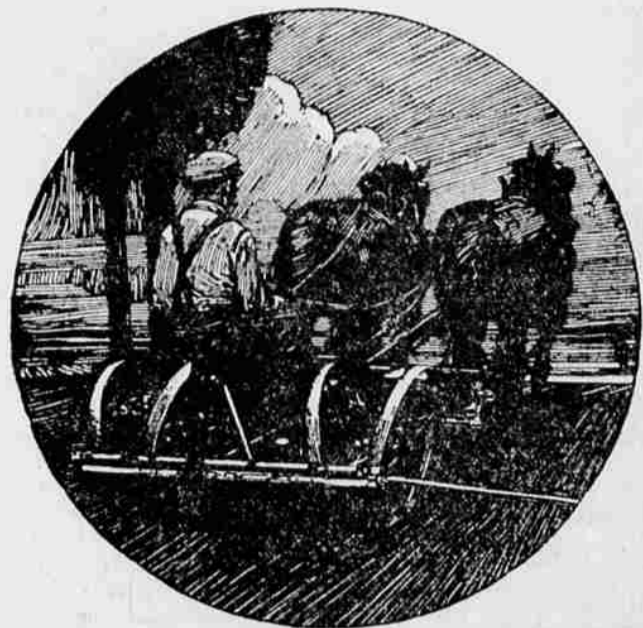
