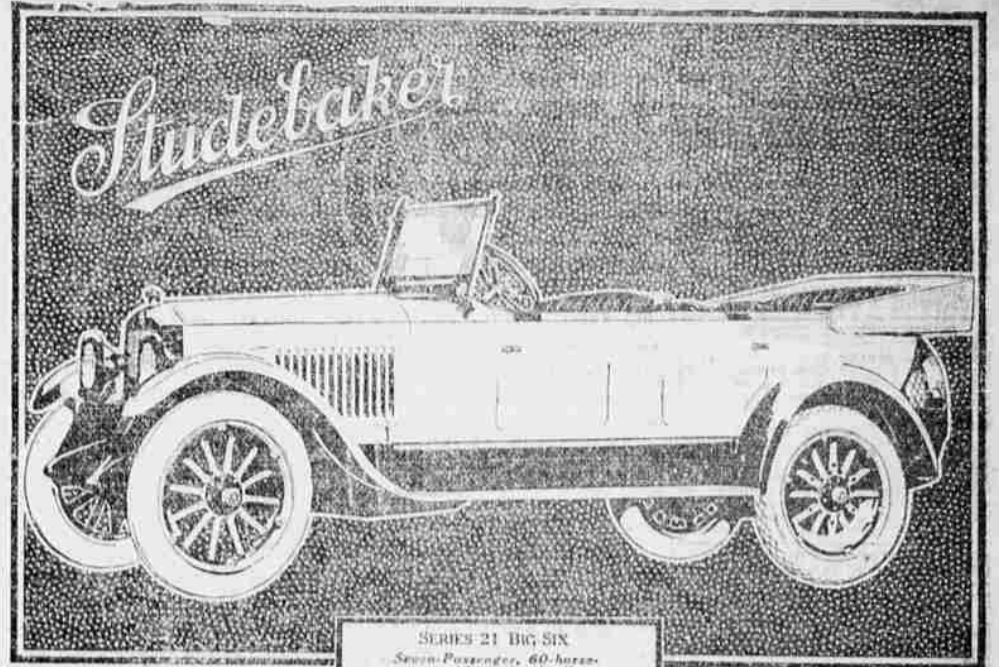


TROTZSKY THREAT AGAINST POLAND TERMED A BLUFF
