ATTEMPT AGAIN TO RECOVER GOLD IN TORPEDOED LINER

LONDON.—Another attempt is to be made this summer by the admiralty to recover the remainder of the billion lost when the armed liner *Laurentic* was mined and sunk off the north coast of Ireland in 1917.

The salvage vessel, *Racer*, together with the Canadian drifter No. 1, will undertake the salvage work for the fourth summer.

The *Laurentic* went down in 29 fathoms (120 feet) of water four miles off the coast of Donegal carrying gold bars to the value of between \$10,000,000 and \$15,000,000.

Four years of pounding by Atlantic gales have reduced the wreck to a shapeless mass and each year the work has been more difficult. Last summer the divers found that about 250 tons of hull and deckplates had settled on the strong room, where the gold was stored, breaking it in. The result was that only about \$25,000 was recovered, compared with \$1,250,000 the previous year.

After the winter storms the divers expect to find the wreckage covered with gravel and silt which has to be cleared away with pumps. Then the steel plates and girders must be cut away.

The *Racer* is now equipped, in addition to every possible contrivance for aiding divers, with a "recompression chamber." A diver can reach the bottom in half a minute but after prolonged immersion at 29 fathoms below the surface half an hour has to be allowed for raising him because if brought up too quickly he is likely to collapse. The great pressure at 29 fathoms saturates the system with nitrogen gas but in the recompression chamber the nitrogen can be eliminated gradually.

The oldest clock now running is at Hampton Court, England, and dates from 1540.

MOVIE GIRLS QUIT STUDIOS FOR CIRCUS LIFE

The lure of the circus has reached several of the California motion picture studios, and in the cast of "Alice in Jangleland," which is featured with the Al G. Barnes circus which comes to Medford on Wednesday, May 4, will be seen a group of young women whose faces are familiar to screen followers.

Miss Mildred Kerr was the first of the studio folk to seek employment with the Barnes circus, and she found the work of rehearsals so congenial that her enthusiasm spread among her friends and as a result the "fairy number" in the spectacle is made up exclusively of young women who have been earning their livelihood in the pictures.

No difficulty would have been experienced in obtaining the contracts of twice as many more young women, as the winter quarters were unleased with applicants just before the show started on tour, but as there were no accommodations for any more, the late comers were disappointed.

While the general conception is that circus life is difficult, the performers do not find it so. The new feminine recruits will ride in the parade, do their parts in the spectacle, ride menagerie horses, enjoy three well-cooked meals in the open, sleep comfortable at night in perfectly appointed Pullmans, and see a lot of the country. In addition they receive much better salaries than are paid by stage attractions for chorus girls.
