GENERAL GRANT'S BIRTHDAY.

NINETY-NINE years ago today, General Ulysses S. Grant was born. The day is being commemorated throughout his home state of Illinois, but the lesson his career teaches might well be pondered upon by every American,—particularly every young American.

For as a young man Grant was a failure. During the first years of the Civil war he was a failure. In spite of his nine years in the regular army his efforts to get a subordinate command resulted in repeated failures.

Even war governor Richard Yates of Illinois repulsed him. "I am sorry to say, Captain, there is nothing for you to do. Call again." The man who was to save the Union, to become president, and to be ranked with his country's immortals, did call again. Finally he was given a desk in the adjutant general's office. He started to muster in soldiers at the rate of \$1 per day. He received a voucher for \$130, but did not receive his money until long after.

Out of funds, lonesome, discouraged, he returned to Springfield, again asked for a command, was again turned away. He left Illinois and went to Ohio, where discouragement continued.

Then his opportunity came. A regiment of roughs, who abused the lax discipline of their commander, was called to the attention of Governor Yates. No one wanted the command. Here was a chance for this persistent state house pest. Grant was offered the place and promptly took it.

His first experience was to have his hat knocked off by one of the rough neck soldiers. "Young man that's not very polite," was Grant's only comment at the time, but step by step he tightened discipline until insubordination was dead and the regiment was a military unit, ready for service.

The first call came to Illinois from General Fremont, who wanted a regiment in northern Missouri. "Send me" was Grant's request to Governor Yates. "No transportation," was the governor's reply.

"I'll find transportation," the Colonel insisted and on July 2, 1861 he issued his first marching orders.

The rest is history. "I propose to fight it out on this line if it takes all summer!" There is the Grant receipt for success, carried out consistently throughout his life. "Not a brilliant man, not in the general sense a genius, but a man who refused to quit,—who kept everlastingly at it."

An excellent example for the younger generation of today, tomorrow or any time.

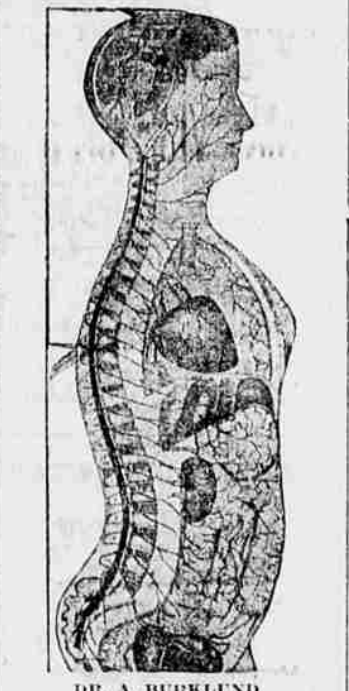
