ASHLAND'S FUND CHINA RELIEF TO GO OVER \$1000

ASHLAND, April 27.—The Chinese relief fund, locally, will go beyond the thousand dollar mark. Fully \$925, if not more, was either paid down or pledged at the armory rally on Sunday night. There was a big attendance, and the "bidding," which started at \$25, was kept up lively on the decreasing basis of \$20, \$15, \$10 and \$5. For the time being the old plea of a multiplicity of drives, heavy quotas, high taxes, etc., was thrown into the discard, and in its stead generous amounts of coin or its equivalent found its way either into contribution boxes or onto subscription papers. A committee headed by Mayor Lamkin will continue the canvass for a brief time longer, and in the meantime the banks will also receive contributions. It is also expected to realize upon the net proceeds of the Oregon Products banquet, which will be diverted to these relief channels. Eventually it is hoped to round up the spontaneous charity gift in a sum approximating \$1200.

What came near being a tragedy occurred Monday morning, an auto, on the Southern Pacific right-of-way being involved with a southbound train. The car, driven by Theo. Elliott, contained four passengers. The scene was near the B street and Mountain avenue crossing, the accident resulting in the car being somewhat damaged, the occupants however fortunately escaping. Only the circumstance of the auto just entering upon the crossing, instead of being midway between tracks, prevented a fearful wreckage.

H. C. Stock's premises in the Nob Hill residence center, are taking on important improvements which have been contemplated for sometime past. Stock merely waiting for the League of Nations to be scrapped before inaugurating the work. The scope of reparations now being bestowed upon the old home will transform it into a model one, enhancing its attractive appearance and pecuniary value at the least by fifty percent. Chris. Miss Florence Marrett will pose as May Queen incident to the observance of a spring fete by the Junior high school on Friday, April 29. This fete will be an elaborate one, over 200 students participating in the pageant. A major portion of the sports athletically will take place in the parks.

Ashland lodge No. 23 will respond to an invitation from Medford lodge No. 103, and visit the neighboring town on Friday of this week, April 29, and assist in the conferring of degrees incident to routine of the Masonic order. Work will begin in the late afternoon, and continue throughout the evening, except during the hours when the craftsmen are traditionally "called from labor to refreshment," a social period ever most generously observed by the Medford fraters in extending hospitalities.

Oregon Products week is being ushered in by appropriate displays, a program of activities to be observed in an informal way. The social event of the period will be a banquet at Elks Temple, Thursday evening, April 28, at 6:30 o'clock sharp. The feast will be provided under direction of ladies of the Chamber of Commerce, and elements entering into composition of edibles will be in keeping with the slogan, "Buy Oregon Products—Eat Oregon Products," admonitions which it is hoped the public will bear in mind. An echo of these festivities may reach far-away China in a material and substantial way, inasmuch as net proceeds of the banquet will supplement the famine relief fund being raised locally. Tickets are one dollar. Secure one, then go and enjoy a fine repast, with the assurance that the price of your meal ticket will be the means of feeding some poor starving mortal in the famine-swept regions of distant Cathay.
