LIVELY TRADING ON STOCK EXCHANGE

NEW YORK, April 30.—Lively trading marked today's short session of the Stock Exchange but the net result was confusing. Motors and their accessories of the rubber tire class were active and almost buoyant, as gains of 1 to 5 1/2 points. Much of the advance was effected at the expense of the shorts. Oils, leathers and some of the food and miscellaneous issues also rose 1 to 1 1/2 points after early hesitancy. Rains were neglected and the more representative steels made little headway. A few recent favorites, including Studebaker, were under pressure. Gains were materially shaded later on profit taking. The closing was irregular. Sales approximated 600,000 shares.
