FISHING STRIKE ON COLUMBIA ENDS

ASTORIA, Ore., May 10.—The ten day strike of Columbia river fishermen has been settled through acceptance of a compromise offer by the fishermen and at six o'clock tonight fishing on all sections of the river will be resumed. The compromise offer which provides that the packers shall pay nine cents a pound for small chinooks and ten cents a pound for large chinooks, all fish weighing 25 pounds each or more, was accepted at a mass meeting of about 1000 fishermen last night.
