ORDER BRITISH WARSHIPS TO BE SOLD FOR JUNK

LONDON, May 12.—Some 200 destroyers, 25 battleships and 50 light cruisers have disappeared from the British navy list during recent months. The British admiralty has issued an announcement saying the vessels were sold to British firms for breaking up.

This statement was the result of reports circulated in America that Great Britain was selling war craft to South American governments for eventual transfer to Japan.

"The only ships disposed of to foreign governments since the armistice" the admiralty informed the Associated Press, "are the battleship Canada and two other vessels which were sold to the Chilean government, for which they were originally built; one sloop to Denmark, two sloops to Portugal and one sloop to Belgium."

BODY OF HERO TO BE BURIED HERE

S. M. Hawk, of 710 West Eleventh street, received a telegram from the war department today notifying him that the body of his son, Russell S. Hawk, killed in action at Chateau Thierry, France July 18, 1918, was being returned to America. The government asked for instructions regarding the shipment of the body. Russell Hawk was a member of the Fifth Marines, and took part in the battle of Belleau Wood. The body will be shipped to this city for burial.

CLARA GETS RIGHT TO OIL LAND AND \$10,000 IN CASH

LOS ANGELES, May 12.—A settlement was effected today by which Clara Smith Hamon relinquished all claim into the estate of Jake L. Hamon, of whose alleged murder she was recently acquitted by an Oklahoma jury. It was announced by her attorney, J. B. Champion.

"An agreement," the attorney said, "has been signed between Frank L. Ketch, administrator of the estate of Jake Hamon and Clara Smith Hamon, whereby in consideration of \$10,000 cash she relinquished all claim to the estate of Hamon, the agreement recognizing an valid certain rights, which the records show are vested in her.

"These are specified royalties and leases in the Hewitt Oil company in the Headton oil field of Central county and other oil interests in Stephens, Center and Cotton counties from which Clara Smith Hamon is drawing royalties. These interests are recognized in documents signed by Jake Hamon."
