**OTTO KLUM TO BE FOOTBALL COACH, HAWAII**

HONOLULU, T. H. May 8.—Appointment of Otto Klum of Medford, Ore., as football mentor of the University of Hawaii was announced here yesterday by President Dean of the school. Klum is a graduate of the Oregon Agricultural college.

Acceptance of the above berth was announced today by Coach Klum of the local high school and a cablegram was received from Honolulu that the signed contract was on the way.

Klum is one of the best known and most successful of the minor school coaches in the northwest, with an enviable record. Most of his work has been with the high schools of Medford and Ashland, where he turned out fast basketball and football teams with the minimum of material. He has the faculty of developing winning teams, his most shining example being the local high school football team of last year.

At the University of Hawaii he will have plenty of material to build into teams. The captain of the football team is Bob Spencer, an old protegee of Klum's in the Ashland high school. The University of Oregon has a football game scheduled with the Hawaii "11" for next Christmas, which will give the local man a chance to show his real worth.

Coach Klum has many friends in this city who regret to see him leave, but are glad to know of his advancement to a larger field.

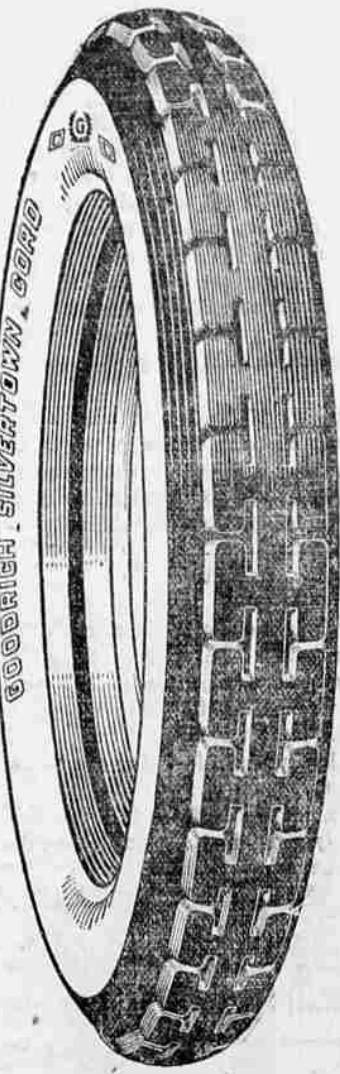
The vocational training departments of the high school will give an exhibit of the work done during the past year next Friday afternoon, May 20th from 2 to 5 o'clock.

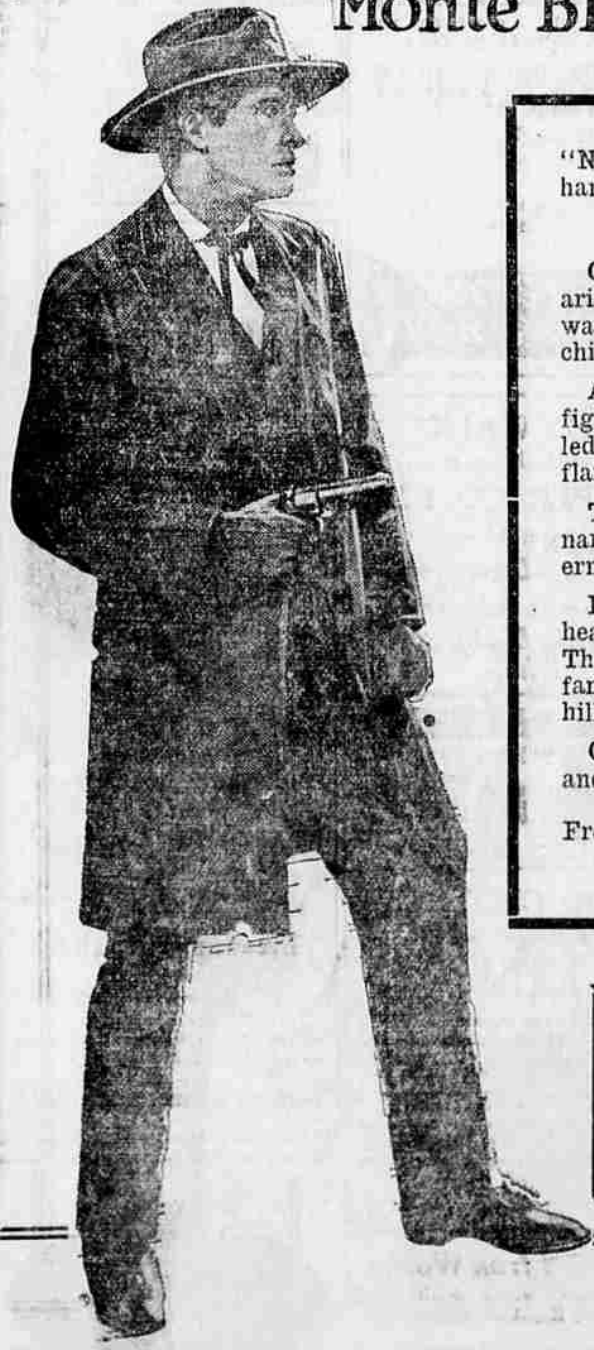
