## TEACHING IN SCHOOLS RAPPED BY EVANGELIST

Tonight is Working Women's night at the tabernacle. They will be served a supper by the Baptist women at the Christian church at 6 p. m. and go to the tabernacle in a body. Dr. Bulgin will speak on an appropriate theme, "How to Be Beautiful, or the Test of Character."

Sunday will be a big day. At 2 p. m. a large parade will take place. Then at 2:30 three meetings will be held: one for men and young men only at the tabernacle when Dr. Bulgin speaks on "Wine, Women and Gambling." Mrs. Lewis speaks to women at the Christian church, and Mr. Lewis to the boys and girls at the Presbyterian church.

Last night Dr. Bulgin spoke on "How to Be Saved." It was a clear and forceful message, and helpful to all seeking light on this important subject. In a nutshell "the way to be saved," said the evangelist, "is to believe in Jesus, and let Jesus do the saving. The way to keep saved is to keep on believing and let Jesus do the keeping." That man and God should do business together is the plan of the universe. It does not make much difference how a sinner goes to hell. If you and God are out of tune you are not prepared to meet Him. To be saved you must know first of all that you are lost. A preacher who does not make the sinner feel that he is lost is a dead failure. To succeed the church must beat the devil. There is little use to talk to people who do not think that they are lost. To be saved, God has not the power to save you against your will. The latch to the human soul is on the inside.

You must also be willing to quit your sinning. There is a world of difference between an erring child of God and a hypocrite. There must again be the purpose to obey Christ. Repentance of sin, faith in Christ, and keeping His ordinances follow. Feeling has no place in salvation. It is not a matter how man feels, but what God says. When a man complies with the conditions of salvation he is saved, whether he feels he is saved or not. Christ also demands a public confession. Believing with the heart gets one right with God; confession gets one right with society. Men are not converted in the same way. Out of the 42 reported conversions in the New Testament no two are alike. When you become a Christian there is no need of worrying about holding out. That is Christ's work. I do not say that a Christian who dances and plays cards will go to hell; it just shows how much steam they gave out. The best way to treat such church members is create a longing within them for heaven.

During the sermon Dr. Bulgin paid his compliments to some of the evolutionists who are teachers in our high school by saying that science has settled that life is not a chemical compound, but a most intricate mechanical mechanism. Where there is a mechanism there is a mechanic. When there is a contrivance there is a contriver. Spontaneous generation of life is unknown to science. It takes a God to solve the riddle. The bible says creation, not evolution.

Materialistic evolution is unknown to science. No scholar in exact science of today believes in evolution. It is an exploded and out of date theory, and only a theory. In each succeeding scale of life the type of life of the next higher life was not evolved. It comes from above. That proves creation, not evolution. When mineral has done its best you must look above for vegetable life. When vegetable has done its best you must look above for animal life. When animal life has done its best you must look above for man. When man has done his best it takes a God to breathe a soul. The origin of matter, life, mind, soul argues a God. An evolution without an involution is a scientific monstrosity. Let your high school professor answer that. It cannot be done. Mind don't follow a dear, sweet Lincoln; a dear, precious Roosevelt, or a dear, darling Foch. We need a red-blooded, rugged, granite, majestic Christ to master men.

## MANUAL TRAINING EXHIBIT AT HIGH SCHOOL TODAY

The manual training department of the high school will have its exhibit in the basement of the building this afternoon from two to five and on Saturday. This exhibit will be moved to the chamber of commerce building, where it can be seen by the public.

The carpentry class has just completed a garage for Edison Marshall. This was built on the school grounds and will be moved to his home. Much interest has been taken in the carpentry work. It is very new but the boys feel that they are getting practical work that will be of use when they get out of the school shop.

Through the courtesy of the Medford planing mill the boys were able to do veneer work. Several table tops were veneered on their large press. A small table leg press was built in the shop and with the use of these machines oak tables such as you see in the furniture stores were made at an average cost of \$14.50.

The merchants have offered prizes for the best work exhibited. The Medford Furniture and Hardware company have offered a prize of \$10.00 value in tools, to include an Atkins silver steel saw, a good Pratt combination square, hammer and screw driver for the best piece of cabinet work. Two other prizes of \$5.00 value in tools are offered, one by the Medford Planing Mill for the second best piece of cabinet work. The other by the Big Pines Lumber company for the best piece of furniture made of Oregon fir.

Another prize of \$2.50 will be offered by Mr. Mentzer, instructor, for the best piece of wood turning exhibited. Besides making many useful articles such as nut bowls, candle sticks, table lamps, card trays and vases, the boys made mallets, chisel handles, file handles and vice handles to replace broken or worn out equipment.
