D'WITT ON TRIAL IN CIRCUIT COURT

W. F. DeWitt, Ashland jitney driver indicted for manslaughter, as a result of the death of Mrs. Nona Jennings of this city, in an auto accident on the Pacific Highway near Talent last Christmas Eve, went on trial in the circuit court this afternoon, at the conclusion of the Myrtle Blakeley retrial.

DeWitt was the driver of the car that crashed into the rear of an auto, behind which Mrs. Jennings was standing, striking her and causing injuries that resulted in her death a few hours later. Mrs. Jennings and her husband were on their way to Ashland to bring friends to their home in this city for the Christmas holidays, and the fatal accident, was preceded by a minor accident in which two autos were ditched.

DeWitt is represented by Attorney George M. Roberts, and the state by District Attorney Hawley Moore.

spent in securing a jury was W. H. Johnson, former cashier of the bank. Johnson identified deposit slips of county funds in the bank, and testified that he had made no application for being named a "depository of Jackson county" during the time Mrs. Blakeley was treasurer.

Johnson further testified in response to a direct question that the bank could not have met its obligations on a hurry call because of being "over-loaned," but if all the obligations due the bank could be collected it would be solvent.

Johnson was excused after a short stay in the witness chair, to be recalled later.

A. C. Walker, county treasurer identified books as being records turned over to him last January by Mrs. Blakeley, when she retired from office.

Marshall Hooper, formerly connected with the state banking board was called as a witness, and gave evidence regarding the solvency of the Bank of Jacksonville. He denied that two sets of books had been maintained by Johnson, but that the former bank official had made notation on the edges of pages, and "kept figures in his head." Hooper was on the stand but five minutes.

A number of women friends of Mrs. Blakeley occupied seats in the court room, and were interested listeners. A girl friend sat by her at the defense table all day.
