THE SPECIAL ELECTION.

NO doubt it will surprise everyone to learn there is a special election June 7th. There has been public apathy at previous elections, but it has never been so universal and intense, as is the case this year.

Perhaps the people will wake up before Tuesday. We hope so. For every measure to be voted on is important, and the verdict at the polls should represent the will of the majority.

The first measure reads as follows:

Submitted by the legislature.—LEGISLATIVE REGULATION AND COMPENSATION AMENDMENT.—Purpose: To establish the duration of the legislative session at not more than sixty days and of an extra session of not more than twenty days; fixing compensation of members thereof at five dollars per day and three dollars for every twenty miles traveled in going to and returning from their place of meeting upon the most usual routes; prohibiting introduction of any bills after the fortieth day of the legislative session, except appropriation bills and bills pertaining to defense of the state or nation, except by consent of four-fifths of the members present, obtained on roll call. Vote YES or NO

This measure is similar to one which nearly passed at the last election, and should be passed on Tuesday. Briefly it is designed to increase efficiency at Salem by restricting the time in which bills can be introduced, and it also raises the legislators' pay to a maximum of \$5 per day,—about equal to that of skilled labor. Both provisions are desirable. Until the prevailing congestion during the close of every legislative session, is eliminated, half baked and undesirable legislation, will follow as a matter of course. The present pay of legislators, renders it practically impossible for a poor man to run for the legislature. Five dollars a day and mileage would no more than cover necessary expenses.

Submitted by the legislature.—WORLD WAR VETERANS' STATE AID FUND, CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.—Purpose: To issue bonds not to exceed three per cent of the assessed valuation of all property in the state to raise money to be loaned in amounts of not more than \$1,000 or paid as a bonus, of \$15 for each month of active service but not exceeding \$500 to each honorably discharged resident of Oregon who served in the United States army, navy or marine corps, between April 6, 1917, and November 11, 1918; to levy an additional annual tax of two mills to pay principal and interest of such bonds; and ratifying correlative legislative enactments. Vote YES or NO

The Mail Tribune has previously announced its stand on the service men's bonus and loan measure. Wherever this legislation has been offered, the people have given their endorsement by an overwhelming majority. The people of Oregon can do no less. Not only is some compensation deserved, but an adverse vote might, in this period of unrest cause serious complications. Taxes are burdensome, the measure will undoubtedly meet with severe opposition, but if every voter personally willing to bear his share of the tax increase, to express his appreciation of what the service men have done, will go to the polls and vote accordingly the measure will carry by a tremendous majority.

The third measure follows:

Submitted by the legislature.—EMERGENCY CLAUSE VETO, CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.—Purpose: To amend section 15a of article V of the constitution of the state of Oregon, empowering the governor to veto provisions in bills which declare emergencies, without thereby affecting any other provisions of such bills. Such power to be in addition to the power to veto single items in appropriation bills. Vote YES or NO

This amendment would correct the present tendency to make the emergency clause a farce and a source of genuine danger, and should be passed.

Submitted by the legislature.—HYGIENIC MARRIAGE EXAMINATION AND LICENSE BILL.—Purpose: To require both applicants for marriage license to submit to and pass an examination by a regularly licensed and competent physician as to their health, in regard to contagious or communicable venereal disease and venality, and in case of failure to pass such examination prohibiting marriage unless one or both applicants are rendered sterile; to establish requirements of physician's certificate and providing for an appeal from order of county clerk denying a license. Vote YES or NO

Here is a measure theoretically sound, but practically useless. If passed it would do no good, and might do much harm. Moreover, the bill is faulty in many particulars. It should be defeated.

Submitted by the legislature.—WOMEN JURORS AND REVISED JURY LAW.—Purpose: To permit women to serve as jurors; to provide a special notice by which women may release themselves from jury service; to require the names of qualified jurors to be ascertained from the latest tax roll and registration books and any other sources of official information; to require the proportional selection of jurors to be made from the registration books as well as from the assessment roll; to require at least one-half of the trial jury to be women in criminal actions involving a minor under eighteen years of age either as defendant or complaining witness. Vote YES or NO

The final measure has been weakened by compelling one-half of the trial jury to be composed of women in actions involving minors, but the other provisions are sufficiently meritorious to warrant an affirmative vote. There is no valid reason why women should be excluded from taking their part in law enforcement, the ease with which they may be excused rendering any hardship improbable.

Ring Sketches of Bygone Years

The coming Dempsey-Carpentier battle for the world's heavyweight championship recalls records of former titleholders.

The first of the modern clashes officially advertised as of heavyweight championship importance took place February 7, 1882 at Mississippi City, just across the Louisiana line from New Orleans. John L. Sullivan knocked out Paddy Ryan with bare fists in the ninth round.

Sullivan, born in Boston, weighed 190 pounds and Ryan, a native of Tipperary, was ten pounds lighter. The Irishman's left jaw was broken in two places by Sullivan's smashes.

Paddy staggered in his dressing quarters to discover that while he had been taking a sound thrashing, some rascals had stolen all of his clothes and the \$300 they contained. He was flat broke, for the winner got the entire purse.

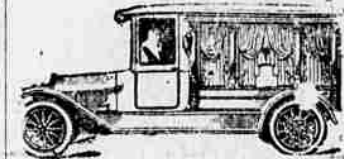
