WASHINGTON, June 6.—Contentions of the Western Union Telegraph company that it cannot be held liable for damages caused through errors in transmitting messages while its lines were under government control were upheld today by the supreme court. A decision of South Carolina courts, awarding damages to S. B. Poston, a cotton dealer, on this ground, was reversed.

Ring Sketches of Bygone Years

Whenever old time fight fans gather and discuss the big battles they have seen the fellow who witnessed the 75 round championship clash between John L. Sullivan and Jake Kilrain July 8, 1889, takes the stage. That lengthy party was all fresco and in defiance of the authorities, the ring being in an open field near the village of Richburg, Miss. The fighters stripped to the waist had no protection from the hottest kind of a blistering summer sun. For two hours and eighteen minutes they banged away at each other and bled and perspired.

At one time Sullivan's stomach showed signs of weakening and Kilrain proposed a draw. Sullivan replied to this suggestion with a blow that knocked the challenger down. Finally Kilrain could no longer stand the punishment and the torrid heat and his seconds flung him a sponge. At the start of the fight, Sheriff Coward of Marion county had stepped forward to insist that it should not go on.

Notice
Unlawful to Fire Slashing During Certain Seasons Without Permit. During the period between June 1st and October 1st, which is hereby designated the closed season, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to set on fire or cause to be set on fire, any slashing, chopping, woodland or brush land either his or their own or the property of another, without written or printed permission from a fire warden, and the compliance thereof, which shall prescribe the conditions upon which the permit is given and which are necessary to be observed in setting such fire and to prevent it from spreading so that life or property of another may be endangered thereby.
