The plan of bordering the great highways of the nation with trees planted to perpetuate the memory of men and women who served during the world war has been recommended to all state departments of the American Legion by F. W. Galbraith, Jr., national commander. The idea originated with the Illinois department and has received the support of the strongest newspapers of the middle west and of high federal and state officials. It is proposed to plant 4,000,000 trees of types recommended by the forestry bureau and set out in accordance with the advice of the bureau. To each tree will be affixed a plate bearing the name and military record of an ex-service man or woman. The Lincoln and Dixie highways would first benefit from the project, according to present plans. Ultimately, it is hoped to honor every veteran of the World war with a tree bearing his name.
