

ARGUE INJUNCTION AGAINST CANAL CO. WITHIN TEN DAYS

In an effort to protect the city water supply system from possible injury the city government of Medford yesterday afternoon filed an injunction suit against the Rogue River Valley Canal company and the Medford Irrigation district, asking that a temporary restraining order be issued against the district and the company, the latter being the contractor building the district system, from prosecuting the work of building the right of way of the city's water pipe supply system.

Judge Calkins granted the temporary injunction and a hearing will be held in court within the next ten days on the question of making the injunction permanent. Gus Newbury is the city's attorney in the injunction proceedings.

It is understood that this action taken by the city is a precautionary one to make sure that the city's water system will be protected through a legal agreement, which the district and the canal company must reach with the city, before the injunction proceedings are dropped. The irrigation ditches will cross the city's pipe line in from 11 to 13 places.

The city's petition alleges that the district plans to construct its ditches over, across and along the right of and in that event the city will be irreparably injured and damaged, and that there will be great and immediate danger of the city pipe line collapsing, thus rendering the city without fire protection and water for other necessities.

The mayor and city councilmen have had the matter under consideration with the officials and engineers of the district and canal company for over a week, and the city officials finally decided it would be best to protect the city's interests by taking the matter into court, although the district and company have insisted from the first that they would do nothing against the city's wishes and would build in accordance with its desires, and above all would do nothing in any way to endanger the city water supply.

FRANCE ABANDONS BATTLESHIPS FOR SUBS, AIR-CRAFT

PARIS, June 10.—(By Associated Press.) The chamber of deputies today adopted the naval program presented Thursday by Deputy Paul Denise, reporter for the naval commission, by 468 to 128.

PARIS, June 10.—(By Associated Press.) In presenting France's program of naval construction for the next three years, Deputy Paul Denise, reporter for the navy commission, advocated yesterday the virtual abandonment of the building of battleships and battle cruisers and intensification of construction of submarines, torpedo boats destroyers and airplane carrying ships.

The program provides for the construction of six light cruisers, twelve destroyers, twelve torpedo boats and thirty-six submarines at an approximate cost of 1,416,000,000 francs.

M. Denise pointed out that France as a pacific nation needed a navy for coast defense, not warships for offensive action, and said there was nothing more to fear from Germany.

SOVIET REVOLUTION PLOT UNCOVERED

COPENHAGEN, June 10.—The police of Stockholm have discovered documents showing that it is intended to start a simultaneous bolshevik revolution in Sweden, Finland and Norway, according to information received here today concerning the alleged revolutionary plot uncovered Thursday as a result of the arrest of a widely known bolshevik leader in Kiruna, in the iron mining district of Sweden.

Papers also were found implicating 400 foreign bolsheviks staying in Sweden who will be arrested and expelled from the country, it is said.

BOOTLEG TRUST IS WHEELER'S CHARGE

WASHINGTON, June 10.—Charges that "certain brewers" and men prominent in big city financial affairs have organized a bootleggers trust which spreads far and wide and has made law enforcement extremely difficult, were made today before the house rules committee by Wayne B. Wheeler, general counsel for the Anti-Saloon League of America.

NEWSPAPER MAN NEW BRY LAW DIRECTOR

WASHINGTON, June 10.—Formal announcement of the appointment of Roy Haynes, a Hillsboro, Ohio, editor, as national prohibition commissioner was made today at the White House. Mr. Haynes, who succeeds John F. Kramer, is expected to take office as soon as he can arrange his personal affairs. The appointment does not require senate confirmation.
