DEMPSEY DENIES HE WILL MARRY AFTER BIG FIGHT

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., June 10.—Jack Dempsey today is enjoying a full 24 hours of rest. The heavyweight champion, becoming weary of the camp routine with boxing off the program decided to take a lay-off and motor over to Camden, N. J.

Someone started a report at camp yesterday that Dempsey intended to be married after his July 2 battle and would retire from the ring as his intended bride was opposed to boxing. The champion issued a denial as did Manager Kearns.
"When I get through with Carpentier I won't lose any time going home to the folks in Salt Lake City. Instead of getting married," Dempsey said, "I've already arranged for transportation on the first train leaving for the west after the match."

MANHASSETT, N. Y., June 10.—Georges Carpentier's physical condition is such now that it would be foolish for him to train too hard, Francois Descamps, his manager, said today. This statement, he said, did not mean that the challenger was not working, but Descamps' announcement bore out the fact that most of the real hard work was being done in private.

Manager Descamps' knowledge of the English language does not permit him, he declared, to express his opinion of a number of writers who have criticized the challenger while watching him at work. George's boss became enraged last week when some rinkside spectators said certain things that fell on Georges' ears and has decided to protect him in the future.
