SOME good people,—very good people,—view this impending Dempsey-Carpentier engagement with an amazed disgust. How any civilized person could pay \$50 to see two pug-uglies maul each other, before a mob of noisy Hooligans, is beyond their powers of comprehension.

There is considerable to sustain this viewpoint and yet it doesn't explain the fact that thousands of average human beings, decently respected in their various communities, coming from all parts of the world, are to view this contest, that more newspaper correspondents, than gathered in Paris during the war, will be in Jersey City, and that in every city and town, in every civilized nation, crowds will gather before the newspaper bulletins on July 2nd, to get the news as it is flashed round by round.

There must be something in this international fistie contest that stirs deep instincts in human nature, that appeals to something more fundamental and less primitive than the mere exchange of blows between two pugilistic gladiators. Otherwise the public reaction would not be so intense or so overwhelming.

And there is. For this contest, between the champion of America and the champion of France is essentially concentrated drama. It appeals not only as the gladiatorial combats appealed with tragedy removed, but as the Greek drama and the problem play. As Mr. Wells has shown in his history, the development of the human race, in the last 1000 years is but the wink of an eyelash as compared with the aeons that preceded, and our emergence from the jungle, was only the day before yesterday, when a perspective from the dawn of life is secured. So even the charge of anachronism falls flat.

Perhaps the point could best be illustrated by Bernard Shaw's description of the Carpentier-Beckett engagement. Now Mr. Shaw is an esthete and an artist. He detests anything that is raw, be it literature or meat. And yet this ring battle thrilled the great Irish dramatist as follows:

The police routed out 3 tourists from a car loaded with household effects Thurs. eve.

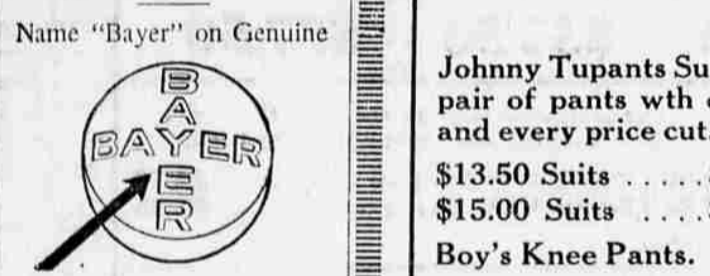
