

LAST CALL FOR FAIR PETITIONS SPECIAL ELECTION

Committees of the Farm Bureau, Fair Association and the Medford Chamber of Commerce having in their charge the circulating of petitions for the improvement of the county fair grounds, desire that these petitions be turned in at the office of the Medford Chamber of Commerce in order that the names thereon may be counted.

In order that the county authorities place the question of improving the fair grounds with building on the ballot so as to permit the people to vote on same, it is necessary that 15 per cent of the 19,531 registered voters sign the petition. A total of 1589 names of voters are necessary and at a recent count more than 1199 names had been secured. Ashland has since sent in the signatures of more than 190 of her registered voters and committees in various parts of the county have been very active.

The one great objection to voters signing the petition is that it calls for a special election. The law under which people are permitted to vote on the question of improving the fair grounds clearly states that this question must be taken up at a special election and it is therefore impossible for same to be considered at any regular election.

Voters of the county who desire to see the fair grounds improved will find an opportunity to sign the petition at the Medford Chamber of Commerce rooms.

per cent of the people could neither read or write. Amid these conditions the germs of Bolshevism were incubated.

I regard Bolshevism as the most dangerous creed born in 1909 years. It appeals primarily to ignorance. This is the great danger of Bolshevism as it spreads to the less advanced nations of the world. America is in less danger than any other nation because of the public school system and the general intelligence of the people. The situation in China and India from the standpoint of the spread of Bolshevism is most serious. To control Bolshevism will tax the statesmanship of the world in the next few years. While it is the natural reaction from the curse of autocracy it is nevertheless the problem with which we must cope.

The second principle necessary for the continuance of a democracy is that the individuals must be kept highly moral, which is the work of vital Christianity. In my opinion the hope for future democratic governments lies, (1) in training the Christian leadership, and (2) in education and Christianization of the waking hordes of the world.

"The duty of a leader is to stand by his organization and its declarations and principles and not run away from any crisis, no matter what it may involve."

The platform is the sum total of all the thought and the work of the movement. I may have contributed to that sum total, but no individual may write the platform for the whole movement."
